
Ken Johnson's Fish Story



BEAR DOWN!!!!! By Joe Luby III

Attached are several photos of my first ever black bear which also happened to be part of Nevada's first ever black bear hunting season. I don't have time right now for the full story, so here are some highlights:

It was a sow estimated around 350lbs (she was huge for a sow). The shot was 200 yards across a canyon as she was walking across the hillside. One shot and she tumbled about 100 yards down the steep slope and came to rest at the pine tree you can see in the photos. I had guys with dogs which is how we got her. We all thought she was a boar because she was so big walking across the hillside in front of the dogs. In fact, I have video where you can hear one of the dog guys saying that "if he's not a boar, it's the biggest sow I've ever seen!" We got her literally in the last hour of the last day I could hunt bears.

This was my 6th trip to the Reno area to hunt plus I went up two other times to scout. So eight trips, three blown tires, one blown axle, one speeding ticket, several frozen/busted water pipes in my camper, one big hole blown through the floor of my camper when a tire blew out, forgotten keys to camper and ATV and probably several other mishaps later - I finally have my bear!!

The bear was the 12th taken overall in the NV season and the 5th sow. The season closes once 6 sows are taken or 20 bears

total, whichever comes first. She is a beautiful dark chocolate color with a long full coat. She had a ton of fat on her and was definitely getting ready for winter. I'm having her mounted in a full body pose to celebrate my first bear, NV's first bear hunt and her extraordinary size for a sow.

Also attached is a photo of Jack with the little mule deer doe he got last month. That makes 3 tags down and 2 to go. So far we've taken doe antelope, doe deer, sow bear (we have a thing for shooting females it seems) and next up are bull elk and bighorn sheep. Kind of neat factoid - all have been taken with the same rifle and


I'm hunting with the same gun on the next two critters also.

On the elk: we head up to units 061 & 071 (Jarbridge area) this weekend. I've never been there and will welcome any suggestions, tips, hints, tricks, secrets and ideas on how to put a tag on a big bull elk. Heck, I'd settle for a small bull elk since this will be my sixth elk hunt and I'm 0 for 5 so far. Anyone is welcome to join us in elk camp also if you just happen to be in the area!


