Mule Deer Presentation by Tony Wasley, NDOW



August 9th at 6pm the LVWW Club will be hosting Tony Wasley, NDOW deer staff specialist to give us a presentation on the mule deer herd in NV and the general health of mule deer populations in the west. Tony has a 90 minute presentation that is very informative. A half hour presentation at our lunch would not do him or the topic justice so we have set this up for Thursday evening August 9th at Arizona Charlie's up stairs in a banquet room. Invite friends and family, we will also be inviting other outdoor wildlife groups to join us getting the word out to hear Tony speak. It will be advertised in the Review Journal and flyers at sporting goods stores. We will also treat this event as a recruiting opportunity for new members to the club. We expect at least a hundred people and quite possi-

Reward Increased for Information on Bighorn Sheep Killing


A \$500 reward has been increased to \$6,500 for information leading to the arrest and prosecution of the person(s) responsible for illegally killing a female bighorn sheep (commonly referred to as a ewe) that was shot in the McCullough Mountain Range, above the Anthem residential community in Henderson on June 6

Initially a \$500.00 reward was offered, but an additional \$6,000 was added to the reward this week. The new reward is possible because new donors have pledged support. New donors Include Nevada Bighorns Unlimited: \$2,500, Fraternity of the Desert Bighorn: \$2,500, Safari Club International Desert Chapter, \$500 and a private citizen who has also donated an additional \$500. In addition, Lamar Outdoor Advertising has donated 16 rotating electronic billboards to seek out information to solve the crime.

The ewe was a lactating female and just over a week later, a lamb was also found dead in the immediate vicinity. There were no injuries to the lamb and it was likely the offspring of the illegally killed ewe.

Anyone with information on the poaching can contact Operation Game Thief (OGT) at (800) 992-3030. Callers may be eligible for the reward and calls will remain anonymous.

The Nevada Department of Wildlife (NDOW) protects, restores and manages fish and wildlife, and promotes fishing, hunting, and boating safety. NDOW's wildlife and habitat conservation efforts are primarily funded by sportsmen's license and conservation fees and a federal surcharge on hunting and fishing gear. 
