LVWWC.



Roger Zueger's Recent Texas hunts

Here is a little update from the not so white Great North. Hunting season is over for the year. It ended January 15th. It starts here in North Dakota on August 15th for Canadian Geese and then progresses through to the other seasons. This year I only shot 5 deer. Two bucks, one whitetail and one muley. We had an early does only season in Sept. shot two does then and on in the regular Nov. season. The muley I shot was going over a hill with 6 does, I knew I had hit him but, also knew he didn't fall. We were hunting on private land with the landowner so, we drove down the road until we could see up the canyon that the deer had run in to. The does were running up the canyon and the buck was slowly walking down the canyon. It was about 350 yards away at that time, I shot it again and it fell. The landowner and I walked out to retrieve the deer and when we got about 20 feet away it got up and started walking away. We had no gun so, I suggested we get around it and herd it back to the truck. Well, it worked for a while and then he just stopped and stared at us. I had a pocket knife with a 3 inch blade so I opened it and started to slowly approach the buck. When you get about 5 feet away from a 5 by 5 rack and look at all those sharp points it gets kind of spooky. I was hoping he didn't decide to attack. When I got close enough I grabbed the rack with my left hand and stabbed him in the lungs with the knife. pulled and ran about 30 feet and fell over. Hе away





I went to Texas for Christmas and then on the 27th went to Bay City with my son for some waterfowl hunting. We hunted geese and ducks over decoys for two mornings and then hunted the afternoons on Matagorda Bay for ducks. We shot some snows and specks and ross's geese. We also shot pintails and some black ducks in the mornings. Out on the bay the ducks were mostly redheads. The shooting was mostly pass shooting so it was fast and furious. I shot a tagged goose that was tagged in 2002 in Canada.

On the 29th we went on a helicopter hunt for wild hogs and coyotes. We shot 14 hogs and 4 coyotes, we also saw a bobcat but, we weren't allowed to shoot it. We hunted on a 6000 acre ranch and it took 2 hours to fly the whole ranch. We ended up taking 177 shots. It isn't a cheap hunt but, it is extremely fun. I will be going again. We got shots at 15 hogs. One got away but, we were chasing 5 at the time. We would fly above the trees and brush and then when we spotted hogs or coyotes the pilot would try to flush them into the open so we could shoot. See y'all (as they say in Texas) at the banquet in March.


Past President Roger Zueger currently lives in North Dakota but as you can see he is doing what we all dream about. Way to go Roger.




