

Silhouette .22 Rifle Shoot at Clark County Shooting Range May 5th (sorry date revised last minute)

We will begin registration at 9 am. It is a rifle silhouette match with .22 rifles ONLY. Targets will be at 100, 75, 50 and 30 yards. Targets must be knocked down to count. 40 shots for record. MikeTaylor (hopefully, if I ask him nice) and I will begin set up at 8 am if anyone wants to come out and help, the targets need painting this time. We'll have coffee, water and muffins for refreshments. Shooters are urged to bring a folding chair, a clip board and a pencil/pen. Ear and eye protection is required. .22 rifles will be fired single shot, scopes or iron sights. If we have enough of each we can do separate classes, but I doubt it. All shooting is off hand unsupported. Entrance fee is standard W&W fee—Cost is \$20.00

Late Season Quail Hunting by Paul Harris

Late season hunt in Cane Springs. I headed up Friday morning with Russell Swain (Swainer) and Steve Reiter in Swains truck. We were towing Swains brand spanking new 40 Foot 5th wheel trailer, (the Taj Mahal). Holy Shit, what a nice rig. Neil Dille and 4 of his buddies were all meeting up at the big corral on the left side of the road. We rolled into camp about 9:45AM and everyone else had already arrived and set up their trailers. We parked Swains Palace and get out for the meet and greet. Poo, a Thai woman hands me a plate with 3 eggs over medium, 5 or 6 pieces of bacon and toast and says "dis fo yo". What a great way to start this trip. It turns out Neil's buddy Jimmy Kesgomol from Thailand likes to hunt. He brings his Thai girl friend (Poo) along to hunting camp and she cooks like a 4 star chef for everyone. I have to admit Poo is a funny name, but she is an awesome cook and great to have in camp. I later found out she works at the Rio as a cook in the buffet.

We got our shit together and jumped in Swainer's Polaris Ranger and headed out to chase quail. I have a tip for you boys. If you actually want to KILL quail, DO NOT GO TO CANE SPRINGS in the later part of the season. Those flipping birds have been shot at and chased around by every idiot in Vegas with a hunting license. So Friday we didn't even see a bird. We rolled back into camp Friday evening and cracked the cold beers and about 30 minutes later the afore mentioned Thai cook Poo announced dinner was ready. She served us a great dinner and we had apple pie for dessert. You know I could definitely get used to this program.

Saturday morning we had about a 20 MPH wind and it was 25 degrees. So our wisdom kicked in and we opted for a truck instead of a 7 mile ATV's ride right into that cold wind. Neil offered to drive so, after an awesome omelet (double helping for me) and pancakes from my new best buddy Poo,

Swainer and me and Reiter all loaded our shit and headed for the area down around the apple orchard in Rainbow Canyon. Once we got into the canyon I promptly spotted a bunch of Mallards down on the creek. The plan was pretty simple. Neil dropped Steve and I about 200 yards downstream and he and Swainer would drive back up the road and come in from above. Pinch them in the middle and whatever way they went someone would get shots. Unfortunately Neil parked the truck just a little too close and when they got out of the truck, the birds took flight and the score was ducks one hunters ZERO. The next group I spotted I marked the tree they were by and Neil parked 300 yards up the road to make damn sure these birds didn't out smart us. Swainer, Steve and I put the stalk on, and just before we got to the water I break left and Swainer and Steve break to the right of the tree. This is what I used to do in Louisiana with my buddies in high school, jump shooting mallards on little bayous. It brings back great memories of those days. Luckily for me the ducks had fed downstream a bit and they took flight right in front of me. I drew a bead on the first big greenhead that I saw and crumpled him and the hen behind him on the first shot. Two ducks dead and a target rich environment. I drew a bead on the next drake and crumpled him. Now I really didn't want to screw up my run, so I folded a big fat mallard hen on my last shot. Swainer got a hen as well and that is all the ducks that fell so we had five out of that bunch. Mr. Reiter was mumbling and grumbling, but he didn't bag a bird. His dog did save face for him and she picked up all five birds on the other side of the creek and kept me from having to get really cold by wading the knee deep water. That was the highlight of the hunt. We did finally find two little bunches of quail and Steve made up for his duck shooting and got the only two quail of the trip for anyone in camp. Swain and I both knocked down birds, but the dogs couldn't find either one.

Another successful camping trip with old friends and a chance to meet some new ones...Poo is welcome in my camp any time.


Spring Feast Shoot and Fixins

Mike Reese won 2nd place of the shoot with a 44 and Larry Wengert won 1st place with an amazing score of 49 out of 50, Great shooting Larry. Club favorite, Clayton Philipp got 3rd place with a score of 39. Non Members got to shoot and eat for the same price as members but were not included in the Lewis class payouts.
