November 3rd Turkey Shoot

Woods & Waters will be hosting our first annual "Turkey Shoot" on November 3rd at the Education Center at the Clark County Shooting Complex. There is no registration fee. Your first target will cost you \$20.00. Shooters MAY purchase and shoot additional targets for a cost of \$5.00 for each additional target. Scores will be posted. This means that you have a chance to improve your score (as many times as you like). Shooters will shoot 10 rounds at a turkey target supplied by the Honcho. Maximum score is 100 points. You may shoot any rifle of your choice, or any pistol of your choice, or both. Pistol turkey targets will be at 25 yards, and rifle turkey targets at 50 yards. All guns will compete in one match as the scores will be the best target from each shooter. The shooter who has the score closest to 100 points will win 50% of the target fees (members only for prizes). The shooter who scores closest to 75 points (without exceeding) will win 25% of the target fees. Honcho



reserves the right to adjust these categories downward based on the performance of the shooters! The targets are the PRIMOS "shotgun patterning turkey targets" and are actual turkey size. This will be a fun way to get ready for Thanksgiving and give the winners something to "gobble about" at Putters!

Hitting the vertebrae within the orange bull is 10 points (feathers don't count). Orange bull (no vertebrae) is 5 points, next ring 4 points, next ring 3 points, and a miss is a miss (miss=zero points, for members that drink "wild turkey" as well as shoot them). Re: The appointment of Ms Karen Layne to the wildlife commission.

What a slap in the face to the sportsmen of Nevada.

You recently appointed Ms. Karen Layne, President of the Las Vegas Valley Humane Society as the "General Public" representative to the Wildlife Commission.

Just read that sentence and try to see the logic in it. President of the Humane Society sitting on the Wildlife Commission? You went against the recommendations of the States CAB's who provided several other much more qualified candidates for the position. As a member of the Clark County Advisory Board to Manage Wildlife I have seen and heard from Ms Layne for the past two years. Her record and position is clear, she is anti-hunting, anti-trapping, anti-horse management.....her record is as follow:

- The Humane Society has clearly stated their goal is to do away with hunting and trapping in the state of Nevada and beyond.
- Ms. Layne recently opposed the re-appointment of dedicated sportsmen (Mike Reese and John Sullivan of the Southern Nevada Wildlife Coalition) back onto the Clark County Advisory Board.
- Ms. Layne has stated that the Wildlife Commission is "doing scary things", like having a bear hunt.
- Ms. Layne has previously testified that she is opposed to mountain lion hunting, the bear hunt, and that "the Wildlife Commission is made up of a bunch of white males out of touch with the public".
- She opposes regulating wild horses.
- She has testified in favor of trap registration.

In the last Wildlife Commission we strongly objected to the appointment of a pro-predator control individual as the "Conservation" representative to the Commission. The appointment of a staunch "Anti" as representing the "General Public" is an even greater travesty.

I do not object to listening and hearing both sides of any issue but Ms Layne has a hidden agenda that is against all that the commission is about. This appointment is another clear expression of the poor direction politics has taken the state of Nevada and the country. Simply put, another bad decision made by an uniformed politician.

Joe Luby tags out again.....cow elk from area 10 plus a couple grouse.



Eric and I hunted 3 days together and we found this nice buck. I shot him at 329 yards right after Eric missed at 328 yards. He measures 22 inches. Weather was too nice. It was still very warm up there. This was the only buck we got, everything else we spotted was too small."





Clark County Advisory Board to Manage Wildlife Next Meeting December 4h 5:30-9 pm at the NDOW offices at 4747 Vegas Drive.




