Sept 22, 2012 Pig carving and shoot sign up start at 12 noon and the event will run until 4 pm.


We have brought back the pig roast for you die hard members so lets help support this event. The food is free for all members, their families and friends! This is one of two free club events each year.

Presidents Message



It's official – hunting season is here! I know some of you have already been out slinging sharp sticks with strings, and I hope you connected on a new world record. But dove season marks the official start of hunting season for me, even when I have an early antelope tag. By the time you read this, I'll have had the good fortune to hunt opening day at Overton as my buddy got lucky and drew a slot this year (four people allowed on an application). I've never hunted Overton on opening day but have heard good things about it.

If you like to hunt, regardless of species, you better get up to speed on what's going on at the Wildlife Commission level here in NV. They've formed a Trapping Committee (with no trappers on it) and tasked them with coming up with zones that should be closed to trapping in the Spring Mountains to appease a few anti-sportsmen folk that live at Mt. Charleston. No wildlife management purpose or scientific supporting data from NDOW. They're just looking for areas to close to lawful trapping because a few people don't like it. Mark my words, if they can do it to trappers for no good reason, they can do it to hunters just the same. Imagine a Hunting Committee (with no hunters on it) set up and tasked with coming up with zones around the state that should be closed to hunting or closed to hunting certain species because some anti-hunters don't like it going on nearby.

Our way of life and passion for the pursuit of game and fish is at risk. If you're not involved to protect our rights, the new club motto may very well become: "We used to hunt and fish and now we just talk about it." See you on the trail...

A new group has formed:

Southern Nevada Outdoor Coalition.

This group is a non-partisan bunch of outdoor enthusiast that are getting involved to meet with and educate our elected officials on the needs and causes of interest to the outdoorsman. Mule Deer Presentation by Tony Wasley, NDOW

On August 9th the LVWW Club hosted Tony Wasley, NDOW deer staff specialist to give us a presentation on the mule deer herd in NV and the general health of mule deer populations in the west. Tony gave 2 hour presentation that is very informative. I learned a lot about the history of mule deer in Nevada as well as the west. He touched on the biology of what deer need to survive the historical highs and lows of the population and the trends. This was a great opportunity to get first hand knowledge on what's going on with our deer herds. We will have to have him down again for those that missed it.

COLORADO ELK HUNT contact Wes Snider 533-0792

Hunt is trespass only, not guided but our success runs 90 to 100 percent.

Bulls are average Colorado bulls with the exceptional large bull thrown in to make it exciting. Hunting is on private land, approximately 45,000 acres. The ranch is located in Area 11 in Colorado roughly 35 miles southwest of Craig. The drive from Vegas is approx. 13-14 hours, depends on number of potty breaks you take.

All elk tags are over the counter, purchased when you get to CO. Deer tags are draw only so it's too late for you this year (we do have exceptionally good deer hunting) Bull elk tags are \$560.00, cow elk tags are \$360.00

We take most of our animals to Maybell Co. for processing they do a very good job (it is up to the hunter to care for their animal including where it actually does go) meat processing fee in Maybell is approx. \$250.00-\$275.00ish depends on additionals like salami, sausage etc.

Sorry, there is no fishing in the area that I know of.

Dates: Saturday October 20th thru Wednesday October 24th (we generally show up the Thurs before to get ready for the hunt).

Fees: \$2,700.00 base price for bull elk, cow elk is and additional \$250.00 (tags and meat processing not included).

Accommodations: Bunk housing with full kitchen, showers/restroom, breakfast and dinners cooked lunch is provided.

Hunters need to bring: Transportation (4 wheel drive or atv type), Drinks, Sleeping bags & pillows, Hunting equipment (guns, optics etc.), any special foods they might want



ROGER ZUEGER past president health update.




Another Successful LVWW Striper Tournament




