

PYRAMID LAKE EARLY SPRING LADDER FISHING

I met up with an old high school buddy in Reno at 4am last Saturday to hit Pyramid Lake for big Lohattan Cutthroats. This time of year you wade out as far as you can with a ladder and climb up then fish off the ladder. Several locals have custom platforms with swivel chairs mounted on top. We got to the lake with 20-30 mph winds coming across the lake straight at us. WAVES were 2-2 1/2 feet high, even breaking over with a curl just like in the ocean. "Cold and windy conditions seem to be best for catching the big ones" according to Norm, my buddy. A couple guys had braved the waves to get their ladders set but Norm and I elected to sit in the truck awhile, waiting till 15 mins before sun up. We headed out gingerly in the dark with head lamps, and when the water was only knee deep the waves would push up well over our waist and splash close to the tops of our waders. We had to keep an eye on the waves and jump up as they rolled in....just like the ocean. Water was spraying our faces and I kept licking my lips thinking I'd taste salt water but this was a fresh water lake, not the ocean. We saw a guy wading around in circles in the dark....he was looking for his custom made ladder with swivel chair that had been blown over and was now nowhere to be found. I kept looking at Norm and saying "man this is crazy" he kept easing into deeper water. We where trying to get lined up with the other 10-15 guys already out on their ladders and fishing. You have to set up early in the dark or you won't get a spot. We were in waist deep water and this guy that was looking for his ladder was 20 yards ahead of us and when a wave would roll in he would disappear from view for a second....that's how big the waves were.

No matter how high I jumped as a wave came in I couldn't stay above wateline. Cold water was over my waders and flooding first my shirt and then my fleece liners, then my under ware and on down to my socks Finally I got my ladder set and scrambled up it to get above the waves. I stood there still knee deep in the water, gloves soaked and an eye on the next wave. I was knocked off my ladder NUMEROUS times, too many to count.

Casting into the wind was a nightmare! I was flailing like a rooky. Norm was not doing much better. We couldn't get off the ladders without holding on to them or they would be washed away. After about 30-45 mins that other guy finally found his ladder. He attached a big bouy to it and set up next to Norm. The next guy over was SLAYING the fish! Literally catching one every cast for awhile then every 2 or 3 casts he would be hooked up! He was also on a custom made STABLE platform ladder with swivel chair so he could land and unhook his fish. It wasn't long and I hooked into a fish. I fought him for a while with 3-4 good runs. In past years I would get off the ladder and back my way toward shore to land the fish in shallow ankle deep water but with the waves I couldn't leave the ladder or it would be gone. I couldn't



land the fish from the ladder because with each big wave I had to hold on to the top or be knocked off. I messed with that fish for about 10 mins before it was played out enough that I could manage to get him to the ladder and reach down and grab it and unhook him for the release. It was a nice fish 18-20 inches and hefty. OK this was worth the suffering conditions. After a few more mins I was just too cold and had to pack it in to warm up at the truck. I carried my ladder and gear back out. Norm stayed with it. The guy next to him had landed over 30 fish and Norm was still at 0 and me at 1.

Norm got cold too so I waded out to him and took his place on his ladder as he went in to warm up. I fished another 30 mins or so and only got knocked off Norms taller ladder once. No more fish for me. Yet the guy next to us landed another 20-25! One looked to be 24-25 inches and well over the 5lb mark. We were both cold and wet and decided to give up. We did drive down the lake a few miles and tried fishing from shore in another spot for about 30-45 mins with no fish. So we called it a day. Norm 0 bp 1. Pretty sorry day of catching. I didn't get a picture of my fish as there was just no way to get all that done on a ladder in those conditions so you will have to take my word for it. I'm headed back up there in 4 weeks, hope to try it again in better weather.
