LVWW Archery shoot July 13th at Sportsman's Warehouse

Sean Cassidy is planning another big archery shoot at Sportsman's Warehouse next month so get ready for those early hunts by tuning up your skills on July 13th.

Ruby Mountains horse pack in fishing trip planned......July 25-28

Neil Dille is putting together a fishing trip in the Ruby Mountains for later this summer. Member Danny Riddle and Hidden Lake Outfitters will be the guide, it will be the last week of July 25-28. Danny will be packing the group into the Ruby Mtn Wilderness on mules to some high alpine lakes to do some fishing. The area includes Farve Lake, Liberty Lake and the Dollar Lakes. If you wish to come early or stay late and fish the nearby Ruby Marsh that is ok. The cost is \$750.00 per person for three days on mules and fishing, all meals and tents are included just bring your float tube, sleeping bag and personal gear. Danny has extra tubes and access to small boats if you wish to fish the Ruby Marsh either before or after the back trip. Lots more information will be coming, we would really like to get some interest in this trip. Due to Forest Service permits the maximum group size is 10. OHV Registration due by July 1st

July 1, 2013 is the final deadline to have your OHV registered in the state of NV. The law went into effect July 1, 2012 but all this year was a grace period. Tickets will be issued after July 1, 2013. Go to NDOW website NOT the DMV site. Down load the forms, fill them out, take your machine to an OHV dealer or police office to verify the serial number (no cost when I did mine). Get the form notarized and send in your \$20 fee. DMV will then mail out the sticker to be attached to your OHV. The sticker is pretty big and it is required to be located on the rear or left side of the OHV, you may have to make a custom bracket or mounting plate to attach the sticker to your OHV, I did.

South Dakota Spring Goose planned

I talked to some of you at the last luncheon about a . Top-notch experienced snow goose guides snow goose hunt for next March 2014. I need at least six hunters to make this a go. I have talked with John Neu who is the outfitter guide. He is saying that the best time to come would be the last week of March. The area is in the north eastern part of South Dakota, the nearest airport is Aberdeen, SD, however, flying to Minneapolis is a lot less. I need to know if those of you that are planning to go want to travel by air or car. My Honda Pilot is always ready to go hunting. A three day hunt would start on March 21st and a four day hunt would start on the 24th. You can check out his website at: www.neuoutdoors.com. To reserve the dates a deposit of 50% is required which is approximately \$300.00 for each hunter. To assure these dates I would like to be able to make the reservation by the middle of July. 
OTTER CREEK RESERVOIR.....Spring Fishing at its Best

The day's weather started out very calm with no wind but we know that always changes at Otter Creek. By lunch time clouds moved in and the wind was creating white caps on the water. We continued fishing and were still catching fish only to take a short break at

lunchtime to refuel our bodies and for me to warm up my feet. The water temperature is very cold just after the ice comes off.




On a side note Harry went back to fish Otter Creek on May 4th by himself and caught and released 50 fish! Springtime fishing is the best!!!!




