

Mike Reese Alaska Fishing Trip 2014



Seventeen of us made the trip this year to the Catch-A-King Lodge in Craig Alaska. Craig is located on the Prince of Wales Island. We flew into Ketchikan and then we catch the puddle jumper out to the island. The weather was the best that I have ever experienced. It was about 60 the first day with nothing but sunshine and then it cooled down to about 55 with a breeze. A stark contrast of the 107 when we left Vegas!!!

We were divided up into groups of 3 fishermen to a boat. Of course I had to help members Randy Tuggle and Tracy Delfante catch the boat limit!!!. The first day everybody contributed equally to the misses and to the hookups but the 2nd day we all struggled as the tide changed and it seem that all the previous hot spots had cooled off a bit. In the last hour of the 2nd day it was like a light switch was turned on and they started hitting everything and we caught 90% of our daily limit in the last hour.

The 3rd and final day was a day I won't soon forget. The wind really picked up and the waves were choppy. We pulled into a cove where we saw 2 nice kings had just been caught. We started our drift but

nothing was biting and the guide kept saying big ones on the bottom!!!! All 3 of us looked at each other and wondered why nobody was getting a hit. 20 minutes go by of "big ones on the bottom" And I hook a silver which didn't take long to land and then another and then another. The other 2 hadn't even had a bite and then the rumblings started about lets go out into the rough sea and at least catch a king. Tracy said no let's just stay right here. Well after about 30 more minutes I brought line up to check my bait and to change it when the guide noticed a knot in my leader...he looked at me and said we better change it and I thought to myself why??? Nothing is even biting!!!

So with my new leader and fresh bait I dropped mine to the bottom and just as I hit the bottom I got a bite and I looked up and my fish had just jumped out of the water and ripped off 250 yards like it was nothing. Just then the other 2 pulled their poles out and the guide put it into reverse and was trying to keep up with the fish. After about 15 minutes and backing up about ½ a mile I got him up to the boat and got to see how big he really was and just then he ripped off another 250 yards of 25lb test line. The guide loosened my drag and I got him to the side of the boat again but as before he ripped off 250 yards and the guide said let him tire out. So that's 3 times that I've had my sinker at the rod tip and 3 times he ripped off line and I was starting to tire. After 30 minutes I had him to the boat a 4th time and this time the guide was able to net him and needed help getting him into the boat.

Yes my arms were noodles and they wanted me to hold him up for a picture and I could barley hold the largest King I have ever caught!!!

The king tipped the scales at 54 pounds and all the guide could say was" now do you know why I changed your leader?". For the rest of my life that king will be known as "The Knot"


