Guns to be used (two of each) Glock 19 9mm, AR-15 (Semi Auto), and a MP5 (Full Auto) 10rds in the Glock, 10rds in the AR, and 20rds in the MP5 and 3 targets.

If you want to bring your own 9mm and/or 5.56mm ammo to the range that day, New Frontier Armory will let you shoot the machine guns after the official Marksman of the Year shoot. The Gettysburg Address



In November, 1863, President Abraham Lincoln traveled to Gettysburg, Pennsylvania to dedicate the battlefield where, in July of that year, Federal troops under George Mead and Robert E. Lee's Army of Northern Virginia fought ferociously for three days, resulting in the highest casualty count of the entire Civil War. Each side lost over 23,000 men, dead, wounded and captured or missing.

General Lee, fresh off a string of dramatic victories over Union forces, pushed his army north with the intent of invading Pennsylvania and moving south to Washington, D.C. where he hoped to threaten the capitol and force Lincoln to seek peace terms.

The Union army was aware of Lee's movement north, and crossed the Potomac to face him. Over 93,000 Union troops took up positions near Gettysburg to challenge Lee's army of over 71,000.

On the first day of the battle, Union troops under Brig. General John Buford occupied the high ground on three ridges west of the town, called Herr Ridge, McPherson Ridge and Seminary Ridge. Buford dug in, but knew he couldn't hold off the confederate troops massing for an attack. Confederate General A.P. Hill sent two corps into the fight while Buford hung on, awaiting reinforcements from Major General John Reynolds' First Corps, who arrived just in time to push back the rebel attack and reinforce Buford's position. General Reynolds was killed that day by a Rebel sniper. The day ended with no significant gains by either side.

On the second day of the battle, both armies had reinforced their ranks to full strength and the Confederates began a series of vicious assaults. General Longstreet's troops set up to attack the Union left flank, but his intelligence was faulty due to the absence of Lee's cavalry under J.E.B. Stuart, who was having a grand old time riding through the countryside, harassing any Union troops he encountered, instead of keeping Lee advised of Union troop positions and strengths.

Longstreet's men notice a Union observation point atop a rise on the Union's left called Little Round Top. There, the 20th Maine division under Colonel Joshua Lawrence Chamberlain found themselves the only defense against Longstreet's forces. Had they lost that battle, the Union army would have been flanked and forced to retreat. But Chamberlain's troops held off the rebel attacks on the hill again and again until it was obvious they would be flanked by a much larger force. That's when Chamberlain ordered his men to fix bayonets and sweep down the hill from left to right directly in the face of the Confederates. The rebels were so surprised by the action, many of them fled and many more simply surrendered. While Chamberlain lost many men in the battle, he is credited with saving the Union army that day.

On the third day came the decisive siege on the center of the Union lines known as Pickett's Charge. Lee was convinced the Union forces were weak in the center and ordered an all out assault, against which Longstreet tried to argue. Lee had his way and around 3:00 P.M. 12,500 confederate troops under General George Pickett stepped from the ridge line of the woods and amassed along a line a mile wide. They advanced across an open field toward the Union ranks three quarters of a mile away, coming under withering artillery and musket fire the entire way. They came close, some rebels actually penetrating the Union center before being pushed back. Over six thousand rebel troops did not return, many dead, many more wounded or captured. It was a disaster of the highest proportions, causing Lee to gather up what was left of his army and limp back to Virginia. The South never recovered, and the Battle of Gettysburg turned the tide in the war.

Many acts of incredible courage took place during that battle, and many men died, but they will never be forgotten because of Lincoln's Gettysburg address.

During his dedication speech in November, Abraham Lincoln spoke only 267 words, but his address that day is thought by many to be the greatest speech ever given.

The Gettysburg Address

November 19, 1863 Abraham Lincoln

"Four score and seven years ago our fathers brought forth on this continent a new nation, conceived in liberty and dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal.

Now we are engaged in a great civil war, testing whether that nation, or any nation so conceived and so dedicated, can long endure. We are met on a great battlefield of that war. We have come to dedicate a portion of that field as a final resting place for those who here gave their lives that that nation might live. It is altogether fitting and proper that we should do this.

But in a larger sense, we cannot dedicate...we cannot consecrate...we cannot hallow this ground. The brave men, living and dead, who struggled here have consecrated it far above our poor power to add or detract.

The world will little note nor long remember what we say here, but it can never forget what they did here. It is for us the living, rather, to be dedicated here to the unfinished work which they who fought here have thus far so nobly advanced. It is rather for us to be here dedicated to the great task remaining before us---that from these honored dead we take increased devotion to that cause for which they gave the last full measure of devotion---that we here highly resolve that these dead shall not have died in vain; that this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom, and that government of the people, by the people and for the people shall not perish from the earth."

November Pistol Silhouette Shoot Results



16 brave souls fought the elements to compete in this year's .22cal pistol silhouette shoot. You know the kind of elements I'm talking about, the kind only Woods and Waters competitors will come out for 70 degree weather, not a cloud in the sky and the wind, well let's just say you couldn't rely on the wind to help you knock over any targets on this day!

The honcho Don Turner took everybody's entry fee, put their name on the list and immediately started barking orders. I guess he wanted all of us to think we were still home or at work! Alan Stone wasted no time in getting into position and proceeded to show us all how it should be done. He shot for a minute and then stopped when Don blew his

sergeants whistle and was given another minute to reload. I don't think that he really needed to reload but he did and when he was done shooting he still had 2 little chickens taunting him as the other 18 targets lay motionless on the ground. As a stark contrast John Fenner was shooting in the lane next to him and he could have used another half hour to reload and shoot again as he had 17 targets still staring him in the face.

There were only two guys who bettered their score when Don gave them a second chance for another five bucks. This was money well spent by Al Schoelen and Clayton Philipp. Al went from only hitting 9 targets the first time to hitting 14 the second time and Clayton Philipp went from only hitting 5 targets the first time to hitting 14 targets the second round, good enough to earn them 7 Marksmen points. Rounding out the five top shooters were Alan Stone, Mike Lussier, Mike Reese, Al Schoelen, Clayton Philipp and David Famiglietti. Thanks to Don Turner and Mike Taylor for helping run this event.

Now we can look forward to the 3 Gun showdown! Yes we actually shoot a pistol, a rifle and a fully automoatic machine gun for score. This will be held December 12th at the Clark County Shooting Complex, check out the Marksman of the Year standings, three guys are in the chase......the final shoot will determine who wins the Award! 
