National Archery in the Schools Program - NASP


LVWW decided last year to spread the wealth and give back o the community. Ken Johnson was the chair of the newly ormed "Give Back Committee". The main focus was clear and Archery in the Schools Pro after just a few meetings that everyone thought youth and he young outdoorsmen/women should be given something o light their fire and spark an interest in the same things we all enjoy...hunting, fishing and talking about it. The commitee presented to the board several ideas and worthy causes hey felt could use some of our finacial assistance. For this irst year the club voted to allocate \$1,000 to be given to two different groups in the form of \$500 each. The two groups selected were the Silver State Shooters a youth trap shooting group and NASP.



NASP is the National Archery in the Schools Program, Holley Stukey has been our lunch speaker telling us about the program. It was started 12 years ago in the southeast getting kids introduced to shooting a bow and arrow and having a standardized competition. All the kids are grouped by grade or age class and all shoot he same equipment, bows, arrows, targets etc are all the same. There is no custimization to the equipment. This program has grown emensly in its first 12 years to now almost all 50 states participate.

NV has not been in the game very long but already there are almost 100 schools involved across the state. February 5th was the Nevada State shoot at the South Point Hotel & Casino. All the schools and teams were here to compete for individual as well as team honors. Top finishers then qualify to shoot at the National Meet held in Louiville Kentucky. This is were LVWW comes in, the high cost of travel to these national meets. Many amilies cannot afford the travel to have their son or daughter compete at the highest level in the country. Our prize was to give \$250 each to the top male and female shooter. When all the targets had been scored the pirls overall winner was Tania Gomez Esquivel and the boys overall winner was Jordan Shultz. Unfortunately or our special presentation neither of the kids were there to recieve the oversized check with their name on it. Tania had to leave early with her team to catch the bus back to campus and Jordan was in a district wrestling ournament in northern Nevada. This was the first time any organization had provided funds for athelets travel expenses and everyone was really excited by our clubs committment to the program. This is a great event and watching the kids compete was really something special.

Speaking of special, there were three men present, all on the US ParaOlympic team. They did a short shootng demenstraion of their skills shooting a bow. Two men had only one arm and one leg (they shot with their
