What: Rifle Silhouette Shoot-Speed and Accuracy Where:100 yard range, Education Center, Clark County Shooting Complex

When: Sign up begins 0800 hrs. Shooting Begins 0900 hrs.

Fee: \$20.00, reshoot, \$ 5.00

Firearm: .22 LR with or without optics, rifle or pistol, rifle and pistol (shooters choice)

Ammo: .22 LR only

Targets: 20 animals: 5 Rams 100 yards, 5 turkeys 75 yards, 5 Javelina 50 yards, 5 chickens 25 yards Course of fire: Start on rams, advance to turkeys,



advance to Javelina, advance to chickens. All animals of one set of 5 must be knocked down before advancing to next set.

Time: 75 seconds

Rules: All shooting from standing position, no support (hint, that includes leaning on tables!), no shooting gloves or shooting jackets, backpacks, etc. All firearms to be kept on gun racks until preparing to shoot, no firearms handling at all (no exceptions) when targets are being changed and people are down range, all muzzles to be kept pointed up, no loading until instructed.

Scoring: All scores will be recorded. Shooter may repeat shoot, but last score is to be registered.

Prizes: Lewis class

Honchos:Turner/Taylor

Scores count for Marksman of the Year....Check the current standings; if your name is NOT Reese you probably aren't on the list.

WE WOULD GO UP TO THE RANCH, IN CHERRY CREEK, ON THOSE NON DRAW YEARS AND DO SOME SCOUTING, BEER DRINKIN, PLOW A NEW GROUND FOR ALFALFA, DRINK BEER, BUILD A LEAN TO SHED, DRINK BEER AND RELIVE ALL OF THE HUNTS THAT WE WERE ON TOGETHER. SINCE WE DIDN'T GET DRAWN THAT MUCH, WE DID A LOT OF THE SCOUTING AND ETC. STUFF. WE SAID WE WERE PUTTING IN FOR A "MEMORY TAG", NOT DEER TAG, BECAUSE EV-ERY TRIP, HUNTING OR NOT, WE PRODUCED MEMORIES.

The Agenda

DON'T FORGET TO GET A FISHING LICENSE

Arrive at the Danny Riddle Ranch sometime Friday, the 24th, time is on your side. You can arrive any time it is convenient for you. If you get there early you can spend the day fishing in the Ruby Marshes or lounging around telling lies and waiting for dinner at 5:00 pm. The trip will take about 7 hours just short of 400 miles. Drive up 93 headed for Wells, Nevada, about 30 miles before you get to Wells, do not go to Wells unless you want to, there will be a junction, highway 229. Turn west, go



about 14 miles then turn left again, headed south, do not go north, there will be a stop sign. About 2 miles the pavement will end, continue on about 1.5 miles. Danny's ranch is on the right side there is red reflector tape on the post by the gate. If it is after dark the red reflector will save you spending the night in your car.

There are wild animals so make sure you close the gate.

Coffee will be ready at 6:00 am Saturday morning, if you want or need a little more for breakfast bring whatever tickles your fancy, breakfast burritos or whatever you want. The meals from that point on will be provided by Hidden Lake Outfitters until we return Monday evening. The Monday evening meal will be on you, we can drive into Wells or head home.

Remember, we will be on horseback so time will not figure in the equation. We will leave the mountains Monday morning and arrive at the Riddle Ranch when we get there. Some of the time will depend on you, how much time you want to fiddle fart on the way home.
