

.38 cal shoot results



October is hunting season, for that reason we generally have not held an event in October. Most everyone that drew a tag is in the field chasing game, but we still had 14 shooters show up for a new pistol shooting event honcho'ed by Alan Stone. The format was fun. A timed portion that required a reload (12 shots at a man sized target) then an untimed portion of 12 shots at a further bulls-eye target and lastly 6 shots at a reactive metal target. The format and scoring established by Alan set the maximum possible score at 246 points. There are a few pretty darn good pistol shooters in the group as the top score and 1st place went to John Mitteness with 231 points. Alan himself was right there in 2nd place at 229 James Vallejo was at 227 in 3rd place and Ralph Willits was close in 4th at 226. Craig Wright rounded out the top five with 215. Those five all collected

points for Marksman of the Year with the rest of the group getting 5 points each.

Six of the 14 participants got paid out in Lewis Class money first through third in two flights, \$45, \$25, and \$15. Thanks to Alan for adding a new event to the Marksman of the Year. He is already planning for next year with the addition of another reactive metal target. Perhaps a bracket style format shooting AR-15's at 100 yards with the dueling trees. The options are endless whatever the honcho can dream up we can do. Do you want to see a new format of shoot for the club? Step up and get it planned. We try to establish the events in January so everyone knows what is available for the year so get your ideas ready to present for the board so we can reserve range time at CCSC.

Another Neil Dille Adventure

Myself, Jimmy K and Bruce Lee received two tags in area 23, first time I have ever received two, normally I never get one. One for a buck deer and one for a cow elk. Never shot a doe or a cow, wasn't too up for the cow thing but I got to go hunting. Last year I never got a tag but Brian Patterson let me go with him to hunt his cow elk with a muzzleloader.

Everything seemed to be a plus, unit is close to home, rented a spot in the RV park in Ursine, could have dinner at the bar, hunting area not very far from where I parked, had my side by side so I could go just about anywhere I wanted. Got to Ursine on Saturday, season did not open until the following Wednesday. I had some time to scout the area without any pressure. The side by side did not last long. First day a bolt fell out of the rear stabilizer, instead of tire being straight up and down it now was at a 45, that was my first issue.



Did not think about it, but area 23 was a plus for every other hunter that received a tag. Had the first couple of scouting days to myself, then the season opened. On every hill, on every road there were hunters. I mean hunters here and hunters there. Decided to go home and wait until later in the season.

Went to Kingston hunting chukars with Russell Swain, Steve Reiter and Ryan Gagnon. When we got there Steve said there was white smoke coming out my exhaust pipe. EGR cooler was leaking water in my exhaust system, headed home. That was my second issue.

Took my truck to Cedar City to have it repaired, why Cedar? Vegas repair bill, \$8,500.00, Cedar \$5,300.00. I had to put water in the radiator about 15 times from Kingston to Vegas and Vegas to Cedar. Just routine procedure limping down the road, until the last time I stopped to add water. Took cap off and it exploded, still not sure why. Spent the next three hours in the ER room in Cedar. My third issue.

I decided the hunting God was pissed off at me and I was out of money. So, my hunting story for the big game 2016 season was not successful but it will be one I never forget.

What Neil failed to include in his story was the last time he stopped to add water to his system just a few miles from Cedar City. When the cap blew and sprayed him with BOILING water and anti-freeze. His left arm and hand were badly burned. Second degree burns to which he had to go to the hospital here in Vegas yet again to get the skin scrubbed off. Luckily his pretty face is still intact, however the white gauze bandages made for a good Halloween mummy costume. I've been on enough outings with Neil to know this is standard procedure. Sure adds some excitement to the trip....yet Neil always has a smile on every adventure.

.22 cal Pistol Turkey Shoot Results

Honcho Don Turner had great weather and 22 shooters came out for the event. The format was fun, only 20 shots and a 2 minute time frame. 5 steel turkey targets had to be hit BEFORE moving on to shoot a life sized turkey head paper target. The time didn't come into play as much as the difficulty at hitting the KILL ZONE on the paper target. Per Don's rules you could not just hit the turkey as drawn on the paper but you had to hit the turkey in the spinal column as drawn on the target. This made it much more difficult with a small 22 pistol at roughly 20 yards. As usual the cream will rise to the top. Ralph Willits won top honors in first place followed by Mark Gallear in 2nd, Al Scholen 3rd, Mark Forsstrom 4th and Mike Lussier in 5th. Lewis Class money was paid out to 9 of the 22 shooters. Newly signed up member Randal Snyder collected some cash. We had one non-member shoot and HAD he joined his membership would have been paid along with the shoot fees and he still would have walked home with money in his pocket. Tell others about the benefits of joining the club for only \$25/year. Many of the guys stayed around to shoot at the steel targets while Don tallied the score sheets. An additional range safety officer was on the line for the shoot as Don stressed the importance of safety prior to the shoot.....job well done, one of the best, well run, safe events of the year.
