#### ICE FISHING AT CAVE LAKE Jan 28th 2017 FIRST ANGLER OF THE YEAR EVENT



For the past several years the LVWW Club has piggybacked our ice fishing event to the Ely Rotary Club Sponsored Ice Fishing Derby. Our club event is FREE but if you want in on the chance to catch a tagged fish worth \$5,000 you must sign up for the official Rotary Club event. Sign up early and book your hotel rooms in Ely early as they sell out, if you think you may want to go book a room, just so you have a place to stay.

Several of us leave on Friday and fish at Sunnyside then roll into Ely at 5-6pm to attend the pre-fishing early sign up party at the Ely Convention Center 4:30-7:30pm. Then we prepare to hit the ice early Saturday morning (5am or so if you want to get a parking spot anywhere near the lake so you don't have to lug your gear for miles). However Neil usually brings his ATV with trailer to shuttle us and our gear to the ice. For safety reasons ATV's are only allowed on the ice before and after the event to help people move gear.

Last year was the first time we had weather to deal with, it snowed most of the day last year but we all had a great time (note ice cycle bottom of vest). The previous 5-6 years it was cold in the morning but once the sun was up and into the canyon you could shed your jacket and apply the sun screen.

Last year our sponsored Boy Scout Troop #130 was on hand to cook breakfast burrito's out on the ice complete with hot coffee and hot chocolate. I hear this year they plan to do something similar and may even be making donuts for us all to try. This really is a fun event. Yeah the fishing is not too technical and you actually have to use bait (worms, eggs, meal worms, power bait, corn etc.) but the group has a BIG TIME. Two time Angler of the Year Larry Cusimano caught a tagged fish two years ago worth \$100. At times the catching can be slow and other times pretty action packed. Last year I slipped into Larry's spot after he gave up and caught 13 fish in the last hour of the tournament.



The Rotary Club has warming fires on the ice and they sell alcohol and food like brauts and hamburgers as well as chili and hot drinks. They do a great job with everything, remember a valid fishing license is required. The club has a power ice auger and a few hand augers are available so getting holes in the ice is a group effort, no need to worry about that.

January 28th 8am-3pm entry fee is \$45 per person, after Jan 15<sup>th</sup> \$55 see entry form on page 5.

# Marksman & Angler of the Year.... new scoring system for 2017

The desire to be the Clubs top Marksman or top Angler is getting more competitive. After all these years it's time to update the scoring for our events. We have always had a pretty fair ranking system for the top guys getting points but we were too generous in giving 5 points to each member that "showed" up to an event. This placed too much emphasis on attending the events and did not reward or separate those that scored well at the event. So a minor change to the scoring is to be implemented this year and is to be used by all Honchos of the events. The honcho of the event still has the discretion to decide the format and how his event will be set up and scores tallied. However these changes will affect how the results of the events are scored for yearlong standings.

Tie scores at events will be decided by "high gun" rules. For example: if 3 people tie for 5<sup>th</sup> place they DO NOT all receive 6 pts. No 6<sup>th</sup> or 7<sup>th</sup> place will be awarded. Rather the point total for those 3 places is 15. (6+5+4=15) the total (15) is then divided by the number of ties (3) so each would receive 5 pts. AGAIN no 6<sup>th</sup> or 7<sup>th</sup> place points would be awarded. 8<sup>th</sup> place would still receive 3 pts.

All-Around standings will be a combination of the Marksman of the Year points + the Angler of the Year points for each individuals TOTAL ALL AROUND score for events for that calendar year. There are three year long running total awards: Marksman of the Year (shooting events only), Angler of the Year (fishing events only) and All-Around Winner (shooting and fishing events combined).

This new scoring system will eliminate the possibility of the "best shower-upper" guy getting 5 pts each time he attends an event and potentially besting someone whom placed high at each event yet may have missed an event or two during the course of the year.

Also more attention will be paid to range safety at the shooting events and safety in general at all events. Range safety is paramount at all shooting events. An additional range safety officer will be assigned to help the honcho monitor and keep the range safe at events. We have been fortunate in 26 years we have not had any accidents at our events and we want to keep it that way. Everyone at events is responsible to keep the event safe and ANYONE can call a cease fire or stop the action if they see something that appears unsafe. At no time should anyone be at the tables handling guns or ammunition during a cease fire when others are down range. One warning will be given and after that you will be asked to leave the event and possibly not allowed to attend any more events. period.

Congratulations to the winners for 2016. Ralph Willits Marksman of the Year, Larry Cusimano Angler of the Year and Ralph Willits All-Around Winner. The results in 2017 should be closer with the new scoring system....everyone has a chance so attend the events and have some FUN.


