### Archery Shoot at Impact Archery 6323 Dean Martin Dr. Feb 18<sup>th</sup> 8am sharp!

Honcho Ralph Willits is in charge of the first Marksman of the Year event for 2017. **February 18<sup>th</sup> at Pacific Archery 6323 Dean Martin Dr. (between Russel/Sunset) 8am** sharp. Cost \$25 or \$30 if you rent a bow. We should be able to shoot 3-6 or so guys at a time. Each shooter shoots 6 rounds on 4 targets; 26 arrows

total. Use your own bow or you can rent one for an additional \$5. Mulligans if we got time -Honcho's discretion.

We only have the range for 2 hours; it shouldn't take anyone more than an hour to set up, practice and shoot all six rounds.



Club will provide donuts and coffee, and there will be a Lewis Class payout. Recommendation to members is to practice before the day of the shoot - especially if you've never shot before and need to learn the equipment you'll be borrowing. ## **Application Time of the Year....**

Tis the season to apply for big game tags around the west. The deadline to apply for Utah spring turkey season has already past...heck I even have the results and a tag in my pocket already for 2017. If you want to be hunting this fall you need to start the application process. Each state does it a bit differently so you need to be familiar with each state you intend to hunt. Some states have bonus points, some have preference points and some have both types. These extra "chances" are a result of being un-successful in the drawing in previous years so in theory the more times you have sat out and not drawn a tag the better your odds of drawing a tag in the next drawing. A bonus point is simply an additional chance to get your name in the drawing. A preference point is usually a pool of applicants that have the MOST points and a percentage of the tags available are set aside for those with maximum points (a guaranteed tag for those guys that year).

So get your hunting buddies together, grab the regulations for the states you plan to hunt, include a calendar and then set the possible dates you could all get together if someone gets lucky and draws that tag of a lifetime. Sheep tags, moose tags heck even an elk tag in Nevada is almost a once in a lifetime tag. One of my buddies drew a Utah bison tag last year. But if you truly plan to hunt every year you must apply in multiple states and you must be diligent in accumulating points. I've been waiting 18, 19, 20 years and have that many points for some hard to draw hunts. Some years I simply purchase a point because time or other hunts would conflict with the scheduled season dates, some years I put in and cross my fingers.

Don't forget, if you plan to apply or go fishing soon your Nevada hunting license expires on February 28<sup>th</sup>. Nevada big game application deadline is April 18, 2017. Results will be posted on Friday afternoon of Memorial Day weekend.

Rough application deadlines are listed below, check with each state to confirm:

February 7 Nevada spring turkey....apply now!

February 14 Arizona elk/antelope....better hurry

February 28 Wyoming sheep moose goat

March 3 Utah all species

March 15 Montana elk/deer

March 16 New Mexico all species

**April 5 Colorado all species** 

**April 18 Nevada all species** 

April 30 Idaho sheep/moose/goat

May 1 Montana sheep/moose/goat

May 15 Oregon all species

May 18 Washington all species

May 31 Wyoming deer/antelope

June 1 Montana antelope

June 2 California all species

June 5 Idaho elk/deer/antelope

June 14 Arizona sheep/deer



I always ask myself, how many good health years to I have left to hunt big game? Will my health allow me to hike to the top of the mountain or will I be road hunting the valley floors? Even a young lad of 30 may only have 30-35-40 more seasons left in him. If you only apply in one state, that's only 30 chances to harvest a big buck and that ASSUMES you draw a tag every year. If you live in Nevada chances are you only draw a tag every 3 years or so.....only 10 more seasons or chances at that buck of a lifetime. Are you successful every season? Probably not, so you may only harvest 5,6,7 deer in that same time frame. When you look at things in that perspective you need to be applying in numerous states for numerous species if you actually hope to hunt/harvest an animal on a consistent basis. Of course if you don't draw a tag you can always hope a friend or even a friend of a friend draws a tag so you can offer to help them out and actually get yourself in the field each fall. So apply in multiple states to up your chances at hunting big game each year. Good luck!

#### **New Mexico Hunting Guide, Client Wounded in Border Ambush**

While guiding an aoudad hunt in Presidio county Texas, a New Mexico hunting guide was shot in the abdomen and seriously wounded Friday night after what appears to have been an attempt to kidnap his clients on the Mexico border.

The guide remains in critical condition in a Texas Hospital. His client was also shot in the arm and is expected to recover.

Multiple assailants fired upon an RV parked near a hunting lodge where the party were staying for the hunt. The contracted hunter and his wife were asleep in the in the RV when the attack began. Walker Daugherty 26 of Chloride NM was wounded while attempting to stop the assailants from taking the RV with his clients inside. He was assisted by another guide Michael Bryant; the men were staying inside the lodge with their wives.

Per a family source, everyone was in bed preparing for an early hunt, the guides and cooks inside the house and the clients in the rental RV parked nearby. Walker heard voices outside and went to see what the noises were, he witnessed men with guns attempting to take the RV, he then ran back inside to get help. Walker and Michael armed themselves to defend and protect the client and to attempt to deter the assailants while the hunter attempted to escape in the RV which was being shot at repeatedly.

The vehicle is riddled with bullet holes from the attack and suffered other structural damage. The attack lasted long enough for Walker to run back to the house and get more ammunition, when he was close to the door his sister, saw him get shot and was able to drag him inside the house and away from the gunfire. The women in the lodge were able to get a spotty cell signal and call 911. The family has been earning a living guiding and outfitting out of the remote ranch for years. The business had experienced several thefts and had been working with the US Border Patrol to apprehend illegal aliens in the area in the past month. The theft events and the attack occurred in the United States. The attack has the family concerned that the attack was not just an attempt to rob the property. They believe the assailants intended to kill all the party. The attackers were strategically placed around the lodge and the men were fired upon from different areas.

The client's wife, a nurse was able to help keep Walker from bleeding to death while they waited several hours for a medivac helicopter to take him to El Paso. It took local law enforcement over an hour to get to the remote scene. The family says the men and their wives were grilled about the veracity of their account by Law Enforcement and the assailants got away and likely returned to Mexico. Kidnapping along with drug and human trafficking, has become common along the Mexico border especially if there are reasons to believe that an intended victim is a person of means. The family however are self-employed outfitters earning a living as guides although the clients were likely the intended targets.

### Las Vegas Retrievers Club Dog Field Trials



The LV dog club will be holding their field trials on Feb 25-26 at Overton Wildlife Management Area. This is a great opportunity to watch bird dogs work in the field....real dog work, not the sort of dog effort most of you in the club employ with your house pet mini poodle or yorkie wanna be retrievers. You all spend more time yelling at, and chasing after, your semi-trained dog than actual bird hunting. Come out to watch how an obedient and well trained dog conducts himself in the field. This is a good learning experience for you the dog handler (please leave your pet at home). As a special benefit for LVWW members the Retriever Club needs volunteers to help with the trials. What sort of help? FUN STUFF! They need volunteers to shoot LIVE ducks so the dogs can retrieve

them. They need 3 volunteers at each field, one to throw the bird in the air, one to shoot it before it flies away and one to back up shooter #1 if he misses (which is a very real possibility after seeing the club trap team shoot). They supply the live ducks and 12 ga ammo, bring your own gun. Lunch speaker to provide more info.

Several of us made the trip to Ely and dressed warm for the day.....the truck thermometer said it was 16 degrees BELOW 0 as we drove to the lake early in the morning. As soon as the sun came up over the mountain though it warmed right up as most of us shed our jackets and gloves. Honcho Neil Dille helped shuttle guys and gear to the ice from the parking lot with his ATV and trailer. Two power ice augers were more than enough to punch holes in the ice.

Scout master Bill Rocheleau and Scout Troop 130 started the day off right with the presentation of colors then they got right to work making hot coffee and

freshly made HOT donuts! Awesome job guys, later in the day they provided warm elk chili, some of Joe Luby's special recipe. The club banners were in place and most of our group (12-14) fished near there. Others were sprinkled around the lake hoping to get into the fish. By wandering away from the main group they are able to "catch" just a few more fish than those that have actual verified witnesses. Everyone I talked to caught fish, some more than others. Joe Luby and Aaron LaDuke were the only anglers that did not catch a fish. Two time past Angler of the Year, Larry Cusimano was tops with 42 fish. Proof that it is not luck at all, Larry is a consistent producer. Ralph Willits in a hole only 2 feet from Larry landed 5 fish (and often times Larry's line), Magdi Ghali fishing on the other side of Larry tallied 14 total (he moved locations several times). So you can see the catching is really a skilled art that some have mastered better than others. It seems to be part science, part rig/equipment set up, part skill, part having the correct bait, and part luck. President Steve Linder was second with 34 fish, Brian Patterson pulled in 32, John Quinn got 17 for 4<sup>th</sup> place, John Treadgill got 16 plus a TAGGED fish worth \$100. Three club members have caught tagged fish over the years. Over 30 tagged fish caught this year. This truly is one of the most fun events that the club puts on, the whole weekend can be done for under \$200, lodging and meals included! Make sure to join in the fun next year, yeah it's a bit cold early in the morning but the day usually warms up and everyone on the ice has a great time.
