I've held this spot in the past but not while also tasked with the GameBag Editor duties, I will do my best for the club and also to honor Dave and his previous hard work.

A service was held March 23rd for Dave and it was WELL attended.

Photos from the Dan Perry Memorial SD Goose Hunt



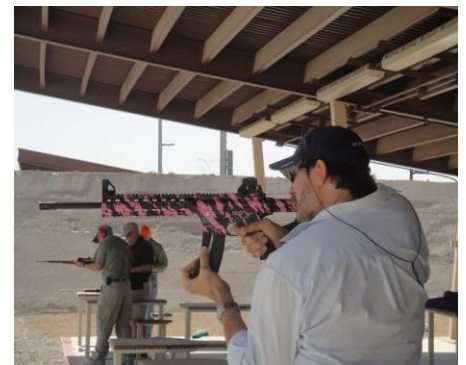

He put on hunts for the club every year to SD for pheasants and geese and to Parker AZ for doves each September along with numerous other trips to San Diego or Mexico fishing, even a popular frogging trip each spring. Dan's trips were the glue that kept this club going the first 10-15 years. I'm not sure who all made the goose hunt this year as they are too bundled up to see who is who but those mentioned above have historically been on this trip.

Give Back Committee news

Committee Chair Steve Reiter has received several requests for funds again this year. These funds can only be given to youth groups located in southern Nevada with a focus on hunting, fishing, trapping, shooting and all things outdoor sport related. We currently have a cap of \$500 per group per request each year with hopes to increase in the future. Those that have requested funds this year include: Walter Johnson Elementary School National Archery in Schools Program NASP, Silver State Clay Breakers trap team, Rancho High School NASP, Pine Crest Academy NASP, Boy Scouts Troop 130, Silver State Wranglers 4H Group and others. The Board will be deciding next month on which groups to support. This is where a portion of all the funds we raise goes each year.

Gun safety rule reminders

1. Always keep the muzzle pointed in a safe direction
2. Firearms should be unloaded when not in use
3. Don't rely on your gun's safety
4. Be sure of your target and what's behind it
5. Use correct ammunition
6. If your gun fails to fire when the trigger is pulled, HANDLE WITH CARE!!
7. Always wear eye and ear protection when shooting
8. Be sure the barrel is clear of obstructions before shooting
9. Don't alter or modify your gun, and service regularly
10. Learn the mechanical and handling characteristics of the firearm you are using.
11. Only approach the firing line when the honcho/RSO says to do so.
12. DO NOT approach the shooting tables when others are down range.
13. Pay attention and listen to the honcho/RSO for shooting instructions before handling any firearm.



The club holds several shooting events each year, so far our safety record is pretty good, no injuries reported. That is not to say we are perfect, I have noticed some safety rule infractions at some events and we all need to be diligent in policing ourselves and bringing infractions to the attention of the honcho, range safety officer RSO and all in attendance. Let's keep our events safe, even the smallest accident is unacceptable.

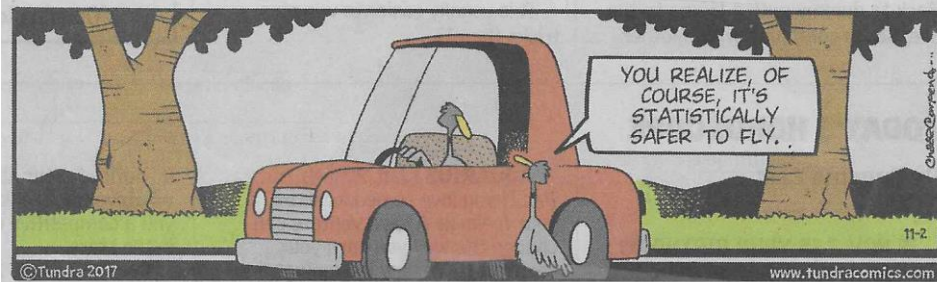
