All shooting will be individual based scoring. Cost is \$45 per person and be prepared to shoot 100+ targets, bring an extra box of shells. **7.5, 8 or 9 shot size only**. Shooting should be over by 11:30 and food will be served soon after with the scores posted and winners announced during lunch. Lewis Class money will be paid out. Lewis Class is a great way to even the field so that anyone no matter your skill level is able to win prize money. Last year we had 44 shooters and 9 of them won money using the lewis Class format. Honcho Mark Transue has reserved four boats, this is the last Angler of the Year event. There are still seats available on one of the guided boats, contact Mark at 702 219-3716 he may be able to get you pared up with a member using his own boat for the event as well if the guide boats fill up. The club subsidized 4 guided boats with each fisherman paying

\$100 of the \$150 fee for his seat. We have a drawing for kids aged 8-18 for a seat on one of the guide boats at the lunch meeting Sept 11. Meet at the Boulder Beach Launch dock at 5:00am and be ready to go. Fishing is over by 10-11am (be at dock early to get official rules) just when the daily temps are getting too hot to be out on the water anyway.

Where/when: 5 AM, meet get rules & safety brief and depart 5:30am Boulder Launch, Tournament Time: Launch to 10AM. Rules: Points will be awarded on honor system, total number of fish (Stripers only) caught, before 10AM. Most Stripers Caught will win the Event. To qualify, a fish must be safely landed inside the boat, witnessed by fellow fishermen. There will also be a \$10 entry (if you wish) for a side pot for biggest fish landed.....payout top 3 fish.

Individual Results can be reported to Mark at the designated cleaning station or the dock and must be reported by 11am to be eligible for scoring. No host Breakfast/lunch at the Fiesta Casino Café is planned after 11AM til?. Winner to be announced around noon.

All LVWW members MUST register with Mark No Later than noon on Wednesday Sept 11 to be eligible for this event.


The KYL shoot was fun last month, too bad only 10 guys came out to try this "new" game. The Firearms Coalition holds this shoot the first Saturday of every month at CCSC so it wasn't a surprise the top two shooters were Jeff Bryant and Don Turner. Both of them had done this before. Several times a shooter (Mike Taylor) would hit 4 or 5 in a row and then get greedy and try to run the table only to miss and have to start all over. His final result was only 1-2 points when he could have stopped at 4-5. Winner Jeff Bryant knew his limit...he got greedy on his first round and after shooting 6 in a row missed and ended up with a zero score, but the next three rounds he laid the gun down after 5 in a row and won overall with a top score of 15 points out of total 32 possible.



We also had some wildlife visit the range that morning. A bat came flying around for several minutes even landing on Mike Taylor while he was shooting. We also had a visit from a roadrunner cruising through the range, he knew he was safe from our crew of shooters.



KYL- Know Your Limits 22 Rifle Shoot Results



We had a new shoot format presented by Honcho Jeff Bryant.

KYL is a 22 long rifle match. There are eight targets ranging from 2" down to $\frac{1}{4}$ " in $\frac{1}{4}$ " increments. They are placed at 50 yards. You have 90 seconds to shoot a maximum of "EIGHT" shots. All shots were from the bench rest position.

Starting at the 2" target working your way in order down to the ¼" target. Here is the kicker or gambling portion. You can stop shooting after hitting any target and keep the targets points "one point per target" you have hit, BUT, if you proceed on when you miss your score reverts to ZERO and you MUST start back at the 2" target "IF you have any of your eight shots left"

Example: if you started shooting and hit the first five targets and stopped you would get 5 points. If you shot at number 6 (the 3/4" sized target) and missed you would start over back at the first target (2") and proceed on but you would only have the two remaining shots from your original eight loaded in to your gun. That's why it's called "Know Your Limits" "Do you feel lucky?"

We had 10 shooters show up and after the first round at 50 yds it was painfully obvious this distance was too far for this group. Jeff pulled the targets into 35-40 yds and then we started to "bang" some steel!

Can you see the 1/4" target at 35yds...neither could we.

CHERRY CREEK RANCH

COYOTE HUNT

Sept 27-29

All these years and NO coyote has been killed. Just think, YOU could be the first to bag a coyote. Think of the bragging rights you will have. The hunt will start on Friday Sept 27th at noon and run until Saturday until 5pm. I have extended the hunting time because it seems we need more. As soon as you turn on to the dirt road leading to the ranch you can start hunting. The FIRST person to bring a coyote to the ranch will win \$100 and of course those bragging rights.

I will be at the ranch on Thursday the 26th if someone wants to come up early. You will have to bring your own food and drinks for the days you will be there except Saturday night, the club will host the dinner that night. We will have rib eye steaks, potatoes and beans.

You will have to bring your RV or tent to sleep in. We have two beds in the bunk house, whomever signs up for those two beds first gets them. There is room for 6 cots in the cook shack if you have a cot. We have a bath house with toilets but no showers. I will be serving breakfast on Sunday morning for those who want to eat before heading home. We will serve scrambled eggs, bacon, pancakes, orange juice and coffee. We will have to charge \$5 for breakfast.

Schedule of events:

Friday: hunt starts at noon but you can start any time you get there after noon. Cards and pool in the cook shack, maybe a drink or two.

Saturday: Hunt until 5pm you can quit anytime you want. For those that quit early we will have a trap shooting tournament at 1pm. Individual competition from the 16, 19 and 22 yard lines. Your total score from those three stations will win 80% of the pot, 20% to second place. \$10 entry fee per shooter. We will have a two man team competition from the 22 yard line, your partner can back you up. Pay out and entry will be the same.

The ranch is located about 60 miles north of Ely, see map. The ranch is primitive to say the least, it consists of 640 acres of mostly grazing land. There is no land power, we use generators to power our camp trailers, and no running water for those of you that will be bringing up your trailers. Last stop for supplies and fuel is Ely so make sure you are prepared.

Directions: Get to Ely (approx. 275 miles)

Leave Ely north on hwy 95 approx 34 miles to Cherry Creek turn off (White Pine Co road #21) left headed west. Travel approx. 7 miles to gravel road (White Pine Co road #25) take a right travel north approx. 8 miles to ranch. Ranch is on the right LVWW signs should be flying proudly.

NDOW Open for Business at NEW Las Vegas Office



(LAS VEGAS, Nevada) - The Nevada Department of Wildlife opened for business at its new office location at **3373 Pepper Lane** in Las Vegas near the intersection of East Sunset and Pecos roads.

This location serves as headquarters for the agency's southern administrative region and houses personnel that previously had been located at multiple locations.

Since this is the regional headquarters, all services are available, including boat registration and fishing or hunting license sales. Customers with boats are asked to park facing eastbound along the yellow zone on the building's

north side. In addition to the yellow curb, the area also is marked by signage reserving the area for boat owners.

Business hours are Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. until 5 p.m.

The Nevada Department of Wildlife (NDOW) protects, restores and manages fish and wildlife, and promotes fishing, hunting, and boating safety. NDOW's wildlife and habitat conservation efforts are primarily funded by sportsmen's license and conservation fees and a federal surcharge on hunting and fishing gear. MOJAVE NATIONAL PRESERVE

The National Park Service has approved a Management Plan for Developed Water Sources in Mojave National Preserve (Plan). The decision was recorded through the approval of a Finding of No Significant Impact.

The NPS selected the preferred alternative of the Plan, which will maintain essential wildlife water developments in wilderness and install new water developments outside of wilderness to improve regional habitat connectivity. The number of water developments for desert bighorn sheep will increase from six to eleven during a multi-year transition period. Based on the results of water use analysis, some of these water developments could be consolidated.

Key points include:

- The NPS will work collaboratively with the California Department of Fish & Wildlife (CDFW) and stakeholders to ensure all decisions regarding water developments are consistent, to the extent possible, with the CDFW Bighorn Sheep Management Plan.
- Selected water developments for birds and small game outside of wilderness will be evaluated and maintained according to their ecological importance.
- Developed springs will be evaluated and maintained based on feasibility and importance.

The selected alternative utilizes water developments for supporting native wildlife and habitat connectivity while protecting wilderness values. Relocating water developments for bighorn sheep to areas with easier access will facilitate their maintenance.

Gun safety rule reminders

- 1. Always keep the muzzle pointed in a safe direction
- 2. Firearms should be unloaded when not in use
- 3. Don't rely on your gun's safety
- 4. Be sure of your target and what's behind it
- 5. Use correct ammunition
- 6. If your gun fails to fire when the trigger is pulled, HANDLE WITH CARE!!
- 7. Always wear eye and ear protection when shooting
- 8. Be sure the barrel is clear of obstructions before shooting
- 9. Don't alter or modify your gun, and service regularly
- 10. Learn the mechanical and handling characteristics of the firearm you are using.
- 11. Only approach the firing line when the honcho/RSO says to do so.
- 12. DO NOT approach the shooting tables when others are down range.
- 13. Pay attention and listen to the honcho/RSO for shooting instructions before handling any firearm.

The club holds several shooting events each year, so far our safety record is pretty good, no injuries reported. We all need to be diligent in policing ourselves and bringing infractions to the attention of the honcho, range safety officer (RSO) and all in attendance. Let's keep our events safe, even the smallest accident is unacceptable.

This information is very interesting and insightful. Something that jumped out at me, the number of elk applications in 2009 was 23,949 and this year in 2019 it has jumped to 60,826. The demand has jumped up A LOT, but so has the number of tags issued in 2009 it was 2,888 this year it was 6,352. The numbers are much worse for deer whose population is declining. Wonder why it's hard to draw a tag?
