Hunting season is now in full swing and I hope you are able to take part in it. I am, but as usual I'm the camp cook again as I can't draw a tag for anything. I have been able get out and scout more than usual because of Covid and I'm seeing lots of creatures. My son and I counted 137 elk from one sitting location and earlier we were able to count over 500 deer from one spot but now that the season is opening or open guess what? Yep they got the memo and changed habits and locations. I'll be with member Larry Cusimano helping him fill his cow elk tag and then with member Mark Gallear helping him to fill his buck tag. My son drew an area 23 bull tag for the black powder season so I'll have to write about that next month.

I've seen 3 hatches of quail this season so I'm excited about that and look forward to the opener for quail.

We don't have an event for Oct and so our next event is our turkey shoot in Nov. We need to hear from our members about how their hunt went, even if you were unsuccessful.

The state wildlife commission did approve their mule deer enhancement program so the details about the program will be coming out shortly.

I've been busy meeting with candidates to help educate them about our public lands and natural resources. Most of them are uneducated about Nevada's wildlife and welcome our input on the managing of these animals as the legislature dictates what and how NDOW is to manage our wildlife. I did a presentation last month on the draw results for big game and I got more after lunch questions than I would have imagined. I sent out the power point to all members so if you have any further questions on the data I'd be more than happy to answer them.

Fall Feast Recap & Photos

Mike and Scott Reese were the honchos for another great club event. A total of 38 shooters took to the course to test how well they handle fast lifelike targets. After all the scoring was complete the usual suspects were at the top of the leader board but the beauty of the Lewis Class Scoring system for prize money allowed others farther down the list to win some prize money. Those winning top honors in their class were \$90-Mike Reese, Russ Johnson and Eric Forsstrom. Second place in each class winning \$45 were Scott Reese, Dan Zelna and Randy Peters.

Overall Marksman of the Year points for the top 9 finishers were as follows: Mike Reese 10 pts, Scott Reese 9 pts, Clayton Phillip 8 pts, Jeff Jorgensen 7 pts, Bruce Young 6 pts, Randy Tuggle 5 pts, Tony O'Neil 4 pts, Frank Mirabelli 3 pts and Michael Reese 2 pts all others received 1 point for participating.

The standings for Marksman of the Year have gotten very competitive with only two shooting events remaining in the year. There are ten guys at the top of the standings separated by only 9 points, with a possible 20 points still on the table to win. As often has been the case, the winner will come down to the final event in December, the 3 Gun Shoot.

Road Kill Grill provided a full BBQ meal for FREE to anyone who came out even if you did not shoot. One of the perks of being a club member is the Spring Feast and Fall Feast where the club will feed you, your family and friends you bring out to the event.

How does Lewis Class work?

Some of you have asked how Lewis class works so here is the explanation for it.

No I didn't invent it:)))). The short version is it's based on the final score of an event. The event promoter decides the number of classes and the payout per class. There is generally one class for every 15 participants. So if an event had 45 participants then there would be 3 classes.

Now here is how Woods and Waters runs a Lewis Class. For every 5 participants in a class we will pay out 1 spot or 1st place so for example the more shooters the more places can be paid out. If we are able to have 15 shooters per class then we will pay out 1st, 2nd and 3rd place but lets say we only have 12 shooters per class then we only have enough money to payout out 1st and 2nd place. On average we get between 20 - 45 participants. The way we break down the payouts is if you win 1st you should receive double (or close to it) the entry fee and 2nd place you should get your entry fee back and if we have enough for 3rd place you should get half of what the entry fee is. It's not always exact but that's what we try to do. Our events cost anywhere from \$20-\$45. We try to build in a \$10 a man cost just for the Lewis Class. Some events the club pays for the range fee and therefore we have more money available for Lewis Class.

For the sporting clay event if we have 45 shooters then we should have \$150 per class allocated but because the event fee is \$45 then 1st place in each flight will get \$90 and that only leaves \$60 for 2nd. Because there are generally ties towards the middle of the pack we don't carry the \$15 over to 3rd. If you would like to see this changed please write up a brief overview of how you think it should be run and we can bring it up at a board meeting and we can vote to change it.

We did this for Marksman points a few years ago when Larry Cusimano brought a proposal to the board and we voted on it and the new scoring system passed.
