March 11th Lunch Program: Mike Reese shotgun shooting tips



.22 LR Pistol Silhoutte Shoot March 14, 2020

100 Yard Range Education Center at Clark County Shooting Complex CCSC **START TIME**: 8am \$20.00 per person \$5.00 Re shoot/ last score counts for records Ties broken by shootoff at Rams at 50 yards. First one to miss goes to next lower ranking

Course of Fire: 20 targets 30 rounds in 3 minutes

5 Rams at 50 yards 5 Turkeys at 35 yards

5 Javelinas at 25 yards

5 Chickens at 15 yards

Targets must be knocked down to count as hit. Awards will get standard Marksman of the Year points for overall placing, 10 pts for 1st place, 9 pts for 2nd place etc. Money payouts will be based on number of entries at the event separated into two or three flights. Payouts as follows: First Place: \$40.00 Second Place \$20.00 Third Place \$10.00 per each flight.

Be sure to join us for the annual Sunnyside "Ice Off" at the Kirch Wildlife Area. On Saturday morning we'll meet up at 8am at the improved Haymeadow boat ramp to start the fishing event, (boats with small motors are allowed). Due to heavy reed/cattail growth shore access is limited to the dams at all the lakes at Sunnyside so a small boat, canoe or float tube is best. Haymeadow Reservoir is not restricted on bait choices per NDOW regulations. This will be an Angler of the Year event and scoring will be simple, most fish caught using the honor system. Don't forget your fishing license! See honcho with fish from last years event...a nice fat rainbow caught right at the boat ramp.

After a quick lunch back at the boat dock some of us will be packing up and heading back to Vegas or heading to the MVWU Banquet in Caliente (see flyer last page) or some may want to try the other reservoirs. This can be a one day excursion for those willing to drive up and back on the same day.



Sunnyside is 175 miles north of town (3 hrs). Haymeadow is the farthest south reservoir (there are 5 reservoirs at Sunnyside, all contain trout and bass). A small group may be heading up with trailers/tents on Friday the 20nd to stay at the campground (bring your own water as I don't think the campground will be fully operational this early in the season). Presidents Message...Mike Reese

A lot is happening this month for our club!! First off, we will be voting to add Gordon Warren back to our board of directors as Josh White has agreed to step down because of his new job requirements. We want to thank Josh for being on the board and for helping with our banquets the last couple of years! Josh will still be a member a good standing and will be trying to attend some of our monthly events. Gordon is also a past president and wants to be active in our decision-making process.

I will be our guest speaker and I'll be showing some videos of how to calculate lead for sporting clay targets. I'm doing this early in hopes that some of our members will go out and practice some before our Spring feast where we will be shooting at 100 sporting clay

targets. I will also demonstrate gun fit and gun mount.

We have two monthly events on Saturday March 14th at 8am which will be a .22 pistol silhouette event. We have the range from 8-4pm that day so immediately following the shoot we have the range for another 4 hours and our members will be able to sight in any firearm they wish free of charge! We will still have to abide by the clubs safety rules as well as the shooting parks. You can shoot pistols as well as rifles after the event but it will only at the 100 yard range.

Then on March 21st we have the Sunnyside fishing event, this is always a great chance to knock some cobwebs off your fishing gear that has been sitting idle most of the winter. The ice has been off for a week or so now and the first spring fishing is generally pretty good. Honcho Brian Patterson can try out the new pontoon boat he won at the WHIN banquet.

On March 16th, the big game draw application will open. Last year we had over 114,000 resident applications for approximately 28,800 tags so good luck for the 2020 hunting season.

Our guest speaker for April will be Aoibheann Cline, who is Nevada's Representative from the Congressional Sportsman's Caucus. She will be flying in from Sacramento to attend our luncheon and give us a perspective of what is on the horizon for sportsmen in Nevada and the west.

I attended the state fur sale on Feb 28th up in Fallon and it was an eye opener for me as to how hard the trapping community works to help keep in check the predator population in Nevada. They really do provide a great service to us sportsmen by protecting our fawns, calves, upland game and even waterfowl. The top bobcat sold for \$1228 this year and the top coyote went for \$387. I will be trying to get a trapper to come and be a lunch speaker for us this year and we are thankful that Tracy Truman donated a trapper experience day to our banquet. My son Michael won the auction for it for \$300 and Tracy will be taking him out during trapping season and will set a dozen or so traps and then will take my son back out a few days later to check the traps and he will get the keep and sell whatever predators were caught!

A Message to the Membership From One of the Old Dinosaurs by Kyle Otto



March 21st we will be fishing at the Wayne Kirsch Wildlife Management Area (aka Sunnyside for us older guys). See the map above for the layout of the different reservoirs. The area is located 5-6 miles on graded dirt road just west of Hwy 318 before you get to Lund NV. All the details for Sunnyside are on the front page of the GameBag.

Comins Lake Fishing April 4th we will be fishing at Comins Lake just south of Ely 6-7 miles off Hwy 6. We hit Comins last year the first week in April and it was EPIC! Lots of spawning fish cruising the shorelines and the catching was pretty easy (for those with the Midas touch, and the correct bait recipe). This will require an over night stay in Ely on Friday April 3 for a full day on the water Saturday April 4. Lodging base is usually the La Quinta Hotel call 775 289-8833 for reservations. They have a nice continental breakfast in the morning. Dinner is usually at Margarita's Mexican Grill located inside the Prospector Hotel.

Note: NDOW has issued a public announcement stating that fish in Comins Lake may contain high levels of mercury. If you plan to harvest your fish and later eat them please check the NDOW website for more information about the mercury warnings.



Fishing will start at 8am, be at the lake before then and gather at the parking area near the first restroom (see area marked on map above) some of us may fish the lower basin but check in will be at the location marked. If you are staying at a different hotel make sure to meet here **before 8am** to get the official rules for the event. FISHING will START at 8am. Plan to fish 6 hrs minimum. Honcho has yet to determine actual rules and duration for the event. Due to the high mercury levels in the lake we may not keep/kill fish for the competition. We may keep only one big fish per person to weigh in? We may go on number of fish landed? Not sure what the format will be at this time.

Fish at Comins generally run 16-22 inches and fight hard. We didn't have much success in January ice fishing but last year we did really well from April to early July, contact honcho Brian Patterson 715-2020 for more info.

Super Slam Hunting

KILL IT AND EAT IT!

PETA (People For The Ethical Treatment Of Animals) and other animal rights zealots are a nutty bunch, to say the least. I run into these whack jobs occasionally, but I mostly see them on TV. They are radical headline-grabbers, with campaigns like their "Unhappy Meal" assault on kids who eat McDonald's hamburgers. Members of PETA and similar groups abhor the thought of killing critters for food, yet at the same time often gallivant around in shoes, belts, and jackets made of leather. Go figure.

Animal protectionist crazies sometimes recommend feeding dogs vegetables instead of meat, and preach that red meat is making Americans fat. PETA folks just naturally hate hunters.

Me, I love a perfectly grilled steak from a deer, elk, pronghorn, caribou, or moose. Beef, pork, lamb, and other domestic meats do tend to be fatty, and too much of this stuff can indeed expand your waistline and clog your arteries. For example, one ounce of lean beef has 82 calories and 5 grams of fat. One ounce of pork loin chop has 60 calories and 3 grams of fat. One ounce of lamb loin chop has 83 calories and 5-1/2 grams of fat. Within reason, a person can enjoy such domestic offerings without ill effect. But by comparison, wild game is incredibly lean and healthy.

For example, one ounce of whitetail deer or elk loin has slightly fewer calories than a same-sized portion of chicken breast, at 45 calories for wild meat and 47 calories for chicken. Chicken, deer, and elk all have about 1gram of fat per ounce. You can literally gorge yourself on such stuff without gaining weight. And contrary to what PETA crackpots claim, lean protein is less likely to make you fat than processed non-animal carbs like bread and pasta.

Humans are predators, the same as coyotes, wolves, mountain lions, and grizzly bears. It is human nature to kill and eat meat. Our eyes are set forward in our heads to allow precise distance judgment to our prey, and our teeth are designed to rip and chew meat as well as veggies. I make no apology for being an animal-killing machine, and I make no apology for loving to eat wild, healthy meat. The PETA folks are the ones who are out of touch with nature, not me.

There is nothing better than backstrap or tenderloin from properly handled big game. Gut the carcass immediately, skin and cool the meat promptly, and you've got terrific food for the table. Some folks try to camouflage the taste of wild game with fancy recipes and sauces. If the meat has not been handled right, it can have a "gamey" flavor that is best covered up. But if meat has been cooled and processed correctly, the natural flavor is excellent.

Here's one of my favorite recipes. Soak wild meat for an hour or two in commercial marinade like mesquite flavor. Toss steaks on a hot grill, and sear each side no more than 5 to 7 minutes. Amateurs usually overcook deer and elk, but the center should be pink for best flavor and tenderness.
