1. Everyone will shoot the supplied Pellet gun at playing cards that are stapled face down on a card board target. "Two complete decks"

2. Once you hit 5 cards (with as many shots as it takes) you will retrieve them, not showing them to anyone else.

3. After all participants have shot their 5 cards, (don't like your poker hand), you have a chance to buy back in and discard <u>up to 4</u> cards (you must keep at least one card). "Buy back in for \$5.00"

4. Buy back cards will be placed back on the target face down and reshot by those buying back in.

5. A second round of buy back will be done "Time allowed" \$5.00 same thing with discarded cards back to target as in the first buy back.

6. Players will show their hands to range master to determine finishing order.

7. Ties if any, will shoot at cards remaining on target and high card wins.

8. Lewis class money is also in play.

New Frontier Armory provided the weapons and ammo. Ivan brought enough ammo for roughly 50 shooters, good thing he did, we had roughly 45 go to the line including scouts and scout parents. Other members (some didn't even shoot the event) really stepped up Bill Dempsy, Fred Huntowski and Greg Klevgard helped keeping magazines loaded with fresh

ammo, sweeping up spent brass and scoring and keeping targets organized. Great job everyone!

Shooting the machine gun BEST usually is the difference and it was not different this year, the guy that scored the highest in the machine (Ralph Willits) also scored the top honors for the event, Ralph also shoots the pistol and rifle very well. Wisconsin Announces 2021 Wolf Hunt



Below is a <u>news release</u> from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) announced the official wolf season will begin Nov. 6, 2021.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service will delist gray wolves from the federal list of endangered species on Jan. 4, 2021, returning management authority to the lower 48 states and tribes.

Under Wisconsin law, when the wolf is delisted, the state's annual hunting and trapping seasons shall resume. The recovery of gray wolves is a triumph of the Endangered Species Act and stands as a testament to the cooperation of federal, state and tribal agencies, as well as other conservation partners working together to support wolf recovery. The most recent monitoring effort indicated a minimum of 1,034 wolves in Wisconsin, primarily across the northern third of the state and the Central Forest region.

The DNR has successfully managed gray wolves for decades and will continue to follow the science and laws that influence our management. All wolf management, including hunting and trapping, will be conducted in a transparent and deliberative process, in which public and tribal participation is encouraged.

Once wolves are removed from the federal list of endangered species, the DNR will work collaboratively and transparently to create a new wolf management plan to reflect our increased understanding of the biological and social issues relevant to wolf management. The new plan will ensure sustainable management of Wisconsin wolves for the future.

In addition, the DNR will also create a new Wolf Management Plan Committee, a group comprised of government agencies, non-governmental organizations, tribal interests and conservation perspectives representing diverse interests. The existing wolf management plan, originally approved in 1999, was reviewed and updated in 2007 and helped guide recovery efforts in the state.

Following delisting – and until the official season goes into effect – it remains unlawful to shoot a wolf unless there is an immediate threat to human safety. However, if on private land, you can shoot and kill wolves that are in the act of killing, wounding or biting a domestic animal.

Although gray wolf management will be under state authority in early 2021, implementing a wolf season requires adequate time not only to develop a science-based harvest quota but also to engage the public and tribal partners in the development of a season plan that adequately reflects the interests of diverse stakeholders throughout Wisconsin. As such, the DNR is focused on planning a wolf season that begins Nov. 6, 2021.

The federal delisting of wolves on Jan. 4, 2021, once again provides Wisconsin the ability to implement an integrated wolf conflict abatement program. Each instance of wolf conflict is unique, and the DNR works with the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Wildlife Services to assess the best management approach on a case-by-case basis. Going forward, the department will be able to implement the most effective abatement measures as wolf conflicts arise, including both nonlethal and lethal options where necessary.

As a reminder, under Wisconsin law, when the wolf is delisted, the state's annual hunting and trapping seasons shall resume. In the meantime, the DNR will continue to partner with USDA-Wildlife Services to address wolf conflicts in Wisconsin.

If you suspect wolves in the depredation of livestock, pets or hunting dogs, or if wolves are exhibiting threatening or dangerous behavior, contact USDA-Wildlife Services staff immediately. Right: Ralph Willits recommends checking your gear prior to heading out fishing (or any adventure) Rainbow Power Bait solidified into one giant HARD blob....that won't happen to a lure or fly....just sayin.

Baits of choice for ice fishing include Power Bait, worms, salmon eggs, ice flies, meal worms etc. The trick to fishing through the ice is smaller presentations on lighter lines and much smaller hooks. 4-6 lb line is the way to go, there are specific ice fishing lines available with less line memory and

thus less coils and kinks, (this really helps but it is not mandatory for catching fish). Shorter rods with sensitive flexible tips rule the hard water, but again your typical fishing gear will work as well. The bite is generally very subtle, so keeping an eye on your rod is key to setting the hook and catching fish. We have seen more than one or two rods lost through the ice by fisherman not keeping an eye on their gear. (ask Steve Reiter)

ICE FISHING JAN 30

See Map for Ice Fishing Location at Comins Lake.

Roughly 5-7 miles south of Ely right off Hwy 93/Hwy 6. Turn right at the lake, drive past the upper lake section (there are 2-3 restrooms you will pass along with the dirt boat ramp area) drive up a slight rise and turn at the first left down to the lower basin. There is a limited amount of parking area in this spot but it has close access to the ice.

The LVWW group will set up across the ice (roughly 200 yards) to the far east side where Steptoe Creek enters the lake. Fresh flowing oxygenated water here usually has the fish stacked up nearby.

The scouts will have flags flying and a LVWW banner on the tables set up for breakfast. The club will be drilling holes, all you have to do is show up with a good attitude and some fishing gear to enjoy the fun.

Don't forget a current NV fishing license!
