Black Powder Shoot June 11th at CCSC

Signups start at 8am, shooting to follow at roughly 8:30. Cost is \$20 to be used for Lewis Class prize payout. The Club purchases all shooting supplies for this event-powder-bullets-primers-swabs-cleaning fluid etc. (50 caliber only) if you have another caliber gun you will need to bring your own supplies.

Don't have a black powder gun? Not to worry, you can barrow a gun. My personal gun has won this event and placed high in this event many times (not with me shooting it, but when someone else barrowed it)

Shooting format:

50 yards bench rest. 3 shots. Load and make ready.

<u>Timer will start at the report of the first shot, you will have 4 minutes to reload twice and shoot twice.</u>

Shooters will review targets and then targets will be relocated to 100 yards. (Or I may set up two targets.) 100 yards bench rest. 2 shots. Load and make ready.

Timer will start at the report of the first shot, you will have 90 seconds to reload once and shoot one final round.

Five (5) total shots fired at target. 3 shots from 50 yards, 2 shots from 100 yards all from the bench. Guns must follow current NV muzzleloader hunting regulations. NO SCOPES, OPEN SIGHTS or PEEP SIGHTS ONLY.

We should have enough time after the shoot to use the range to sight in your hunting rifle. If you drew a tag and want to shoot your gun bring it out. We have the 100 yard range till 12 noon to use for recreational shooting.


May Panguitch Fishing Recap

EVERYONE caught fish, some caught a lot, some caught a few, almost all weighed in around the 1.5lb mark but two fish hit the 2.0+ mark. Super Slam Hunting

BARBED WIRE TRAGEDIES

few years ago, I came upon a sad sight during the Montana archery season. A beautiful 6x7 bull elk (estimated score 365) had waded into a large sumac bush to thrash it with his antlers. I cannot imagine that elk's terror when an ancient, hidden roll of barbed wire became tangled in his rack.

What followed must have been pure panic. The wire was wrapped dozens of times around the rack and several times around the animal's throat. He had rolled like a fish on a line, because the 20-foot double strand of wire between the stout bush and the bull was twisted so many times it had begun twisting upon itself. The bush was torn to shreds, but the sturdy stalks held the wire like a vise. I'm sure the bull rotated more than 100 times before he expired. The carcass was still warm, so I had narrowly missed the terrible event.

Just last fall, I was bowhunting in Wyoming when I noticed something hanging from a fence in the distance. A close inspection revealed another barbed wire tragedy. A record-sized pronghorn had tried to jump (yes, antelope do sometimes go over fences) and caught his rear end between the two top wires. It was certainly a prolonged and painful death.

The very next day, I found the carcass of a calf elk trapped in a similar fashion by both hind legs. Young elk typically have trouble sliding under or jumping over cattle fences that adult animal can clear with ease. Once snagged, it's all over for these unfortunate critters.


Barbed wire is a necessary evil in livestock country, but poses a threat to wildlife. I've been told that western landowner Ted Turner removes all interior fences from the large ranches he buys to reduce this risk. I did the same on my own modest spread near Cody, Wyoming, after several mule deer smashed into fences or died when hind legs became jammed between the upper strands during a jump.

One smart fencing strategy is installing smooth wire as top and bottom strands. Livestock will still be contained, but chances are less that big game will become ensnared when going under or over.

All of us can make a modest contribution to animal safety in places where we hunt. If you see old balls or rolls of wire in the hunting woods, consider how dangerous these can be to the animals you love. Hang them high in a tree, or better yet, remove them with a landowner's permission. Game animals are too precious to waste, and deserve better than a slow, agonizing barbed wire death.

Neil Dille & Brian Patterson left LV to visit past president Paul Harris in South Dakota to shoot prarrie dogs, my brother drove over from Wyoming and Pat Goldhammer (Harris business partner and previous club member) joined the group. Anyone remember losing Goldhammer at a strip club in San Diego on one of our tuna fishing trips some 20+ years ago?



We camped right at the edge of the Badlands, great sunrise and sunsets, even had a bighorn sheep walk right out of the Badlands next to camp about 100-150 yards. Goldhammer was the "connection guide" he got us access to several ranch properties to shoot dogs. One rancher actually owned the land with the roadside prarrie dog feeding area and told us to start shooting just some 100-200 yards from the parking area, we didn't feel too comfortable with that set up. At another spot with a historic homestead along the highway (another roadside attraction) he told us to shoot but just leave the albino dogs alone. Again we were positioned within 100-200 yards of tourists looking at wildlife....not a good mix. The next day we met another rancher that had us shooting in a dog town some 1-2 miles long and roughly a mile wide. We had a BLAST!!!!!! Each shooter got at least one "double" two dogs in one shot. Harris had his "Yellow Corvette" gun and another 22-250 with a 0.2 once trigger (yes way less than 1/16 of a pound pull) we shot dogs out to 600-700 yards.




