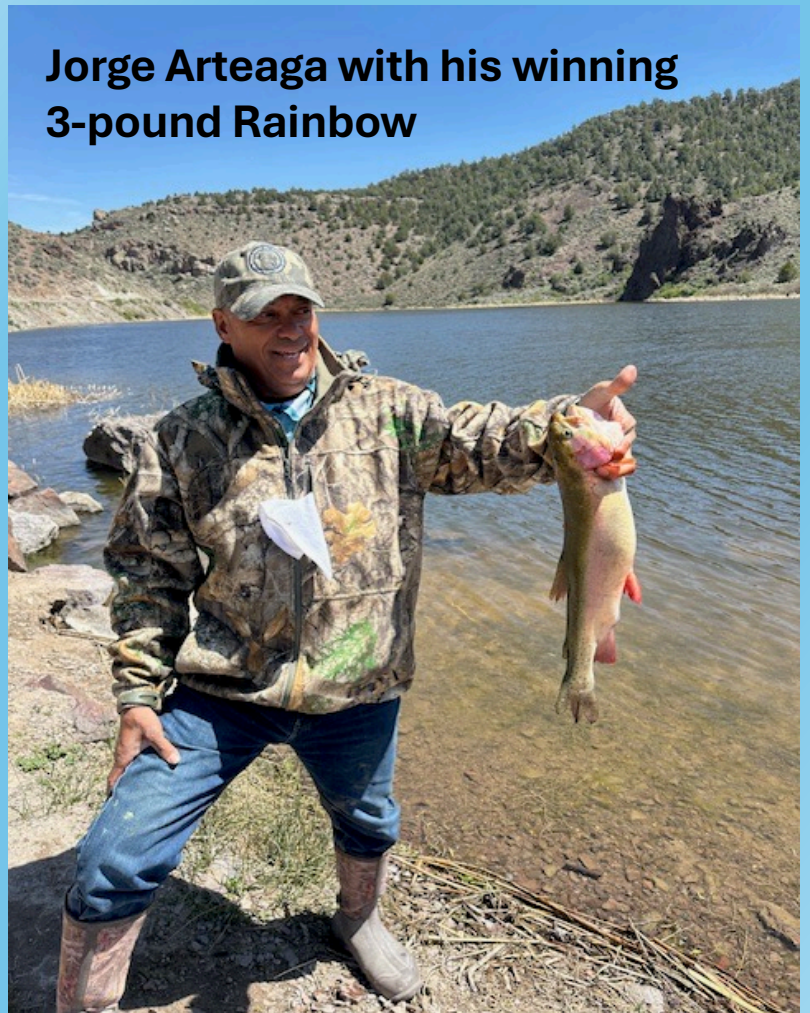

DUELING TREE SHOOT OFF

SATURDAY MAY 16TH

Clark County Shooting Park.

Signups at 8:00 AM

Shooting at 8:30 AM.



This will be a centerfire pistol competition.

- Calibers up to .40. **NO** .41, **NO** .44,
- **NO** .45 etc. will be permitted. Revolver or semi-auto.
- Open sites only. No laser, red dot, etc. **OPEN SITES ONLY.**

The competition will consist of a dueling tree where two shooters will be drawn randomly to face off against one another (No, that is not *face* each other!) There will be three paddles on each side, total of six. Shooters will load with six rounds only. When the start is called, each will shoot the paddle on his side forcing it to the opponent's side. If any swing to your side, shoot it back to your opponent. When each has fired all six rounds, whoever has the least paddles on his side wins. If a shooter gets all six paddles to his opponent's side, that too will be judged as a victory even if either shooter still has rounds left. No reloading - 6 shots only.

The format is double elimination, so everyone gets to shoot twice. Winners move on to compete with other winners until all but one is left. If necessary, ranking for points/ties/Lewis class will be decided by the number of hits the shooter accumulates.

Late entries cannot be accepted as all competitors will be logged into the computer that will assign who shoots against who. You cannot pick who you shoot against.

Bring at least 12 rounds, more if you think there are any club member that shoot worse than you and you pair up with them.

CAB update for April



In April 2026, the primary news regarding the Clark County Advisory Board to Manage Wildlife (CCABMW) centered on preparations for establishing upcoming hunting quotas and regional conservation efforts.

Key April Developments

2026-2027 Tag Recommendations: The board prepared to review and make recommendations for the number of tags issued for big game species—including **mule deer, antelope, elk, moose, bighorn sheep, and mountain goat**—for the 2026-2027 season.

Flyover Data Analysis: Wildlife biologists conducted aerial flyovers in early spring to gather critical habitat and fawn rate data. This information is essential for the board's upcoming May recommendations, as they aim to base quotas on physical counts rather than just previous harvest data.

Migratory Bird Regulations: The board continued discussions on aligning regional seasons and bag limits for migratory game birds with the 2026-2027 federal framework established by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

Recent Conservation & Public News

"Bioblitz" Species Recording: While not a board meeting itself, a major wildlife event called the **City Nature Challenge** took place across Clark County from **April 24–27, 2026**. Participants were encouraged to record as many local species as possible to provide "research grade" data for ongoing conservation efforts.

Predation Management: The board recently reviewed the second draft of the **Fiscal Year 2027 Predation Management Plan**, incorporating public feedback regarding habitat restoration and sagebrush loss.

Second Amendment News



In April 2026, major Second Amendment developments included a sweeping rollback of gun regulations by the Trump administration, proposed USPS rule changes for mailing handguns, and key Supreme Court discussions regarding carry permits. Federal action aims to repeal previous restrictions and modernize firearms handling rules.

Key April 2026 Developments:

Massive ATF Regulatory Reform: On April 29, 2026, the ATF announced 34 proposed rules, including removing the bump stock ruling, simplifying National Firearms Act (NFA) transport approvals, and allowing married couples to register NFA items jointly without trusts.

USPS Handgun Mail Proposal: A proposal emerged in April/May 2026 to allow the mailing of handguns through the USPS, aligning their policy with existing rules for long-barreled rifles and shotguns. This has drawn opposition from several state attorneys general who argue it undermines state-level gun laws.

Supreme Court Activity: On April 17, 2026, the Supreme Court discussed several cases, including a challenge to Maryland's failure to recognize Virginia's concealed carry permit, addressing interstate reciprocity.

Machine Gun Ban Upheld: The 11th Circuit Court of Appeals unanimously upheld the federal ban on machine gun conversion devices, citing *District of Columbia v. Heller*.

Legal Landscape:

The administration is focusing on overturning regulations from previous years, arguing that many earlier restrictions exceeded legal boundaries and created unnecessary burdens for law-abiding gun owners. Critics, including gun safety organizations, argue these changes remove vital tools for law enforcement.

Idaho names hunting official state sport thanks to fourth grader's initiative

Idaho officially declares hunting as its state sport, thanks to 9-year-old Betty Grandy, whose initiative turned a simple idea into law.

BOISE, Idaho — Hunting is now Idaho’s official state sport after Gov. Brad Little signed House Bill 652 into law Monday, standing alongside 9-year-old Betty Grandy, the Twin Falls fourth grader who originally brought the idea to the Statehouse.

Betty, a homeschooler, said she feels proud of her accomplishment and amazed by how many people she met while turning a simple idea into law. The new designation will take effect on July 1.



“It feels glad that I could help, and I feel thankful to all the people who helped me,” Betty said.

The idea began with a poll in her self-run newspaper, *The Grandy Gazette*, where she asked subscribers to choose among skiing, whitewater rafting, ice skating, fishing, and hunting/archery. Hunting emerged as the overwhelming favorite.

Her mother, Diana Grandy, said the choice was no surprise. “We have a tradition. When we're on a road trip, the first member of the family to see a wild animal gets to pick dessert that night. You’d be surprised how many wild cows my kids see, but we love to go out looking for wild game and just enjoying nature,” she said.

Local Politics in Action

Betty's proposal caught the attention of Gov. Little, who met with her several times and supported the legislation through the Legislature, which approved it with little resistance.

"When hunting first won, we got out the whiteboard so she could kind of build her case, and one of the first things she said was, well, when we're out in the wilderness, we don't have internet access, so I think this will be good to encourage people to get off the internet. And I just thought, like, that was the first time I realized, I think you've really hit on something that's just the perfect symbol for our state," said Diana Grandy.

Family members celebrated the milestone. Betty's uncle, Caleb Drake, who owns an archery shop said, "So my life kind of revolves around hunting. To have my niece go out and get hunting officially recognized means a lot to me because it's such a passion and a career for me."

Not everyone agrees that hunting qualifies as a sport, but Betty sees it differently.

"It's a sport not because you hit a ball or anything. It's a sport because you get out there and have fun. You can enjoy it and it gets your body moving, and that's how it's a sport," she said.

After months of effort, one promise remained: the celebratory ice cream her father owed her that she asked about in a previous committee meeting.

When asked if she got that ice cream yet she said.

"No, but he is going to today," Betty said.

Betty has already completed hunter safety and received her passport, excited to go scouting with her dad, grandpa, and the rest of her family. Her mother said the experience has been the ultimate civics lesson, showing how a young person can influence state law.

Recipe of the Month

Depending on what part of the United States you find yourself in you will most likely have a species of Catfish, or two, or even three for that matter to fill your freezer with. Blue and Channel Catfish are about the most common and easily found within the United States. They both share the same waters and you can catch them utilizing the same bait and tactics. Blue's can get up to about 100 pounds where Channel's get up to about 30, however there have been some Blue's caught in the 300 pound plus range.

With that said this was before we started recording and weighing these magnificent tasty beasts! Both of these species can be caught on almost anything. Simply bait your hook, and cast out near the shore or out in the middle of your area and let it sit inches to 3 feet off of the bottom of the lake, river, or stream. Since they are bottom feeders and clean the waterways the more pungent your bait the better. People use anything from hotdogs to liver to night crawlers. Personally I don't like to waste anything so I like to take old bait (Shad) and put it in the freezer for the next fishing excursion and then bring back any left overs to refreeze. When you do this the constant freezing, thawing, and freezing creates a certain smell that they just can't resist! If you are finicky about the smell on your hands get some gloves or you can just buy some Chicken Livers or Night crawlers and head out to the water.

The third Cat on the list is my favorite, which is the Flathead Catfish weighing in at over 100 pounds, which requires an entirely different tactic for putting them in the freezer. This particular recipe was done with Channel Cats, since that is what is most abundant in my local waterways.

Growing up we used to go out and set night hooks and go Jugging, but times have changed and so have laws. So check with your local Wildlife enforcement agency and see what methods you can use legally. I was going to use the Jugging method to catch Cats for this recipe, but when I asked the Game Warden about it he asked "What part of the backwoods are you from?" I responded with "Alabama me and my Grandma used to do it all the time.." He concluded with "Yeah... you can't do that here.."

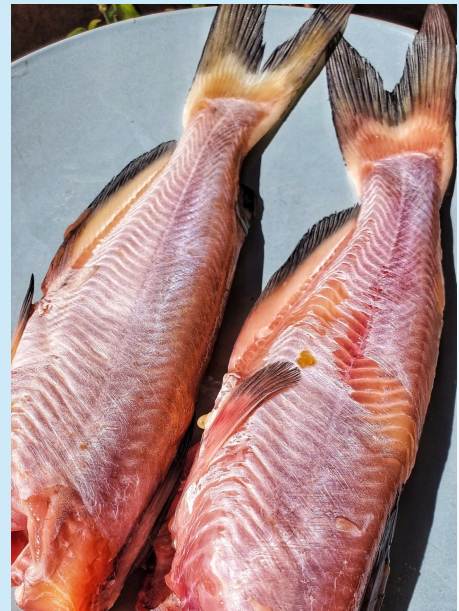
So, these guys were caught on a regular line and hook... The best time to catch Catfish is during the night, but you can have luck catching them during the day as well.. just bring a book and enjoy the scenery.

Recipe of the Month



Some people say these bottom feeders, unlike the Flat heads that feed on live fish, have a certain... taste, but the trick is to remove all of the fat from your fish before cooking them. This makes a world of difference. I know it may sound strange since we love fat on our meat, and oftentimes that is where the flavor is, but in this case skip it. You don't have to throw the fat out, you can use it along with the skins to flash fry for your pooches and you can use the guts and heads to catch crawdads. If you happen to come across some eggs then save them. They are actually really tasty! So, with all that said let's wake up to some breakfast!!!

Air Fried Cats!!!

Ingredients:

2-4 Skinned Cats
2 Tablespoons of Olive Oil
1 Cup of Hush Puppy Mix
1 Egg
2 Cups of Buttermilk



Servings:

Should be good for 2 people depending upon appetite.

Prep Time:

15 Mins

Cook Time:

14 Minutes or until the meat is able to be flaked with a fork

Directions:

- 1:
Preheat your Air Fryer to 400 degrees
- 2:
Whisk your Buttermilk and egg together in a bowl big enough to dip the Catfish in.
- 3:
Pat Dry your Catfish from any residual water that might still be on them.
- 4:
Brush the Catfish inside and out with the Olive Oil
- 5:
Dip the Catfish in the Buttermilk and Egg concoction. (Don't let it soak!! Just dip it)
- 6:
Generously coat the Catfish with the Hush puppy mix
- 7:
The Air Fryer should be preheated at this point. Add the coated Catfish making sure that you do not overcrowd the basket.
- 8:
Cook for about 14 minutes making sure to flip the Catfish at the halfway point.
- 9:
Go pour you something to drink and enjoy!!

Don't be afraid to experiment in the kitchen or out on the grill. You don't have to be a Chef in order to cook up some good quality time with your family and friends. At the end of the day if you mess up your dish you can always have a good laugh and order a pizza.
